We're going to take some items up out of order to do it in the most efficient fashion for folks, specifically staff who have come to visit us today. I do want to start with citizen communication in general. Is there anyone who wishes to, any citizen who wishes to communicate with the Ethics Commission that has not filled out a form and already come up? Okay. We're going to reach those, because I believe they all go to agenda items; we're going to reach those when we reach the agenda items. Okay, one more. So unless there is an objection I would like to move to item 3A, which is discussion and possible action regarding city council election candidate foreign planning, including reports from working group and from staff, and I'd like to, I believe, defer to staff for an update on our 10-1 forums. Thank you all for being here.

50FossThank you. My name is Lara Foss and I am new with the Public Information51Office. Patricia Prada is my predecessor, she was working on 10-1 until my52supervisor realized it was pretty much a full time position, and so that is my53focus, and so I have taken over the duties that Patricia Prada was doing. She54has met with the Ethics Review Commission, and the League of Women55Voters, and so I have taken the reins from those projects.

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- 57 So we are here today to provide an update on the venues and dates that we've 58 settled on for the venue forums. Cindy, do you want to go to slide number one? I have a very, very brief presentation, and if you can read that at all, 59 60 everybody has a handout with the dates and venues which we settled on. The 61 Asian American Resource Center for district number one, North West 62 Recreation Center for districts seven and four, and there was some back and 63 forth on districts six and ten. We've had some controversy about the 64 church, so we have steered clear of that and landed at Hope Presbyterian 65 Church for six and ten; eight and five at the Stassney location of Austin 66 Community College; district nine at Palmer Event Center. Two and three will be at the Montopolis Recreation Center, and the Mayoral candidate forum will 67 be at the Austin Convention Center. 68 69
- 70If we need a run off forum, my hunch is we will, it will be back in chambers,71and we'll have all of the construction finished by then. Do you want me to add72anything it's a really short presentation guys. I'm pretty much just here to73present that these are the places we have landed on.74
- 75 So here is an update for you guys. We are in the CardPlus July edition, and 76 they gave us a ton of real estate, the entire back page, and if you want to go 77 slide number three, as I said it's pretty short, we are in discussions about being 78 also in the August edition. This is not yet formatted, but this is pending 79 approval, but if they ahead they will give us some more real estate in the 80 August edition too. We get the 10-1 logo in there and we just wanted to see it 81 go a bit differently and go to registration, and getting out the vote with of 82 course all the ways that citizens can figure out which district they're in, and 83 any resources they need to look up regarding 10-1.
- 85 Also online we created a candidate resources page, which we have our 86 candidates fleshed out, and they'll be able to go the back page and access a 87 candidate Q & A resource, so they can see what other candidate's questions, 88 what candidates are asking, then have access to all the answers on an equal 89 playing field. They also want to use that resource as a place to sign up for their 90 candidate's statements, and we will record the five minute candidate statements from September 22^{nd} through October 3^{rd} , and then we'll have a couple of dates through to the 8^{th} for any who were unable to make it. So 91 92 93 they'll be able to make reservations through that candidate resources site. And 94 I think that's the last line. 95
- Price I just have a few questions. I apologize. Francis, I know you're here. Did you want to add anything to the presentation on behalf of the League of Women Voters?

- 100FrancisUnless you all have some questions, we're all ready for forums, and our101volunteers are in line and all the questions are in line. The candidates will not102see the questions before they are asked.103
- 104PriceYes, that's what I was going to ask. And I mean I was on the subcommittee,105unfortunately I was not able to attend any of the meetings, which explains106another reason why I am doing what I am doing later on the agenda. I guess107my only question was, and I kind of put this out there, is one, how was it108decided that district four and seven, that four would go first, or seven would109go first?
- 111FossSo that's a great question. What we decided to do is the district that has the112most amount of candidates will go second. So that all the forums that start113second will start at the same time, which is 7:30 I believe, and so there won't114be any time constraints for the districts that have many, many candidates115running in it. For example, ten.
- 117FrancisIf you have six, or eight, or ten, or eleven candidates, you can get very few118questions in one hour. You know, so what we decided to do, was when there119were two together to put the one that had the most candidates, as the second120forum, so that if we needed to we could go over, because you can't go over121with the first one.
- 123PriceYes, you know, I'm actually fine with it. I just know that a lot of people are124like me, and it isn't until it actually occurs that they start wondering why it125was done, and I just want to make sure since the Ethics Commission is all on126this document, that there's going to be some actual and practical reasons. The127other question is...
- 129FrancisAnd we won't go on for two hours, but we will want to get in a decent number130of questions.
- 132FossThat was the question. We went back and forth on it and decided that in the133forum that one with the most candidates goes second.134
- 135PriceYes, I think that's a great response, and great reasoning, and I think it makes136sense to have them have more time than an hour and a half. I think people will137be able to get their information out. The other question of course is, and the138reason I'm focusing on district four and seven, I'm in four, why was it decided139to be in one area like Northwest Rec?
- 141FrancisThe city planned all the places, and there was so much criteria they needed to
satisfy.
- 143 144 Price Okay.

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145146FrancisThey needed to have it where a number of people, so that at least a hundred147people could get in it, and have it that channel six could come to it and film it,148and so they made the decision on where, hopefully close enough, so that both149districts could get to that place without too much trouble. There were a lot of

150 151		places that look like they could have met, but they didn't. They didn't really come together.
152 153 154 155 156 157 158 159 160 161	Price	Okay, we'll just see. Because I know that some of them seem to be a little bit far afield from where the district ends. Like where district four ends, the Northwest Rec center is pretty far from there. So I just want to make sure that when people start asking - I'm not saying it wasn't a good idea - I'm just saying that when the questions start asking, and people feel there is some favoritism, that the city, and the Ethics Commission, since we're doing it, has some really practical reasons. And I understand what you guys all are saying; I just think we need to be ready for some conversations.

165 166 167 168 169	Francis	I'm sure that's going to be a lot cheaper then. I think we did a really good job, even though it's true that some of them are closer to one district than another, but it had to do with what's available.
170 171 172	Foss	And, Velva, on four and seven, in particular, if there are more candidates than four seven will go first so the folks that have to come all the way from four will have a little more time to get there.
173 174 175	Price	Yes, I know.
176 177 178	Lara	And all the ones that came a little bit further will have a little bit of time to get back.
173 179 180 181 182 183 184	Price	I understand all of that and I'm in four and I know we have eleven potential candidates, that's what I've seen that in articles, but I just know that we've all been here in this wonderful city of ours for a long time, and people have very strong opinions, and I just want to make sure we are all in consensus about why we decided to do it the way it was done.
185 186 187	Foss	There's another point. All of them are free except one. We've have only had to pay for one of them, and that was the Hope Presbyterian Church.
188 189	Francis	It was difficult to find some place that was even halfway because
190 191 192 193	Foss	They all had to be ADA accessible, they all had to be on accessible public transportation routes, so as Francis said, they are all
193 194 195 196 197 198	Price	No, I'm not disputing, I know you guys did a great job, I know you worked really hard, and I'm really sorry I wasn't able to be there in person due to my own schedule, but I just know that we're going to have some conversations and some questions, and I just know that we're going to have to say that it was very thought out, that we looked at all of the options, and these are the reasons

199		why we did what we did. And so I just want to make sure that that is said, and
200		that people are going to be contacting the commissioners, me.
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202 203	Francis	Yes, you're right. That's a question to be ready for, because it's going to come.

203 206 207 208 209 210 211 212 213	Ruiz	We discussed that, and we came to the conclusion that there are all these live online and on TV, and beyond that there are all these, and to be as successful as possible, for everyone to get there, you know, advertise on radio, TV. Yes, we decided that planning was a much more difficult process than we anticipated, and then we realized that there is going to be a lot of attention to that, and no matter what decision we make, people are going to analyze it and ask questions.

294		try to get folks who have come to address us, to kind of get to go sooner rather
295		than later. Janette, did you have something that you wanted to offer for us with
296		respect to the training of conflicts of interest? Like a presentation or anything
297		like that?
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299 Janette No presentation, just kind of an update. 300 301 Okay, do you need to run sooner rather than later? Kaplan 302 303 Janette No, I don't think so. I'm listening to some of your other items. 304 305 Kaplan Okay, very good. I just want to make sure that I've got everybody where they 306 need to be. In that case, I would like to move along, unless there's any 307 objection, to item 4A. That's a staff briefing on the City Auditor's Integrity 308 Unit Complaint and Investigation Procedures and Reports, including the 309 Auditor's report on allegations on the Zero Waste Commissioner regarding Daniela Ochoa Gonzalez. We have here a representative from the City 310 311 Auditor's office who is going to provide us with a presentation. 312 313 Hadvai Good evening Commissioners, my name's Jason Hadavi, I'm the Chief of 314 Investigations with the City Auditor's Integrity Unit, I'm here to do today's presentation. I believe you all received an e-mail from our office regarding our 315 ability to discuss, or specifically our inability to discuss the details of the 316 investigation, we stand behind the findings in the report, and for the reasons I 317 explained in the e-mail, our work papers are covered by an exemption from 318 319 the Texas Public Information Act, and in order to fully seize that exemption 320 and protect our work papers and to protect identities of witnesses cooperating 321 with our investigations, we don't discuss the details of our investigation 322 without authority in any report. 323 324 That being said, the second part of the agenda item asked for a brief on our 325 investigative process. I have a presentation, what looks to be a blurry presentation, here today. 326 327 328 I wanted to start with authoritative guidance. There's a number of different 329 documents that address the Auditor's authority to do investigations starting 330 with city charter article seven, section seventeen, the term here actually used is investigative audit, but it does list that as one of the responsibilities of the city 331 332 Auditor. The second one is city code 2-3-5. This is the powers and duties 333 section related to the city Auditor's office, there is a number of responsibilities and duties outlined there. One of which includes investigations, this time the 334 335 term investigations was used as opposed to investigative audit, but there is a 336 responsibility to conduct investigations included in that section of the city 337 code. 338 339 And finally, the city's fraud, waste and abuse administrative bulletin, this is a document that is equivalent to city policy, put out by the city manager's office, 340 341 this was drafted, I forget how many years ago now, but by the Management 342 Integrity Committee, which is an internal committee to focus on ethics issues, and in addition to listing the city Auditor's responsibility, is it outlines the 343 344 possibilities of a number of investigate authorities. It talks about the 345 responsibilities of management, of employees who cooperate with investigations, and human resources department, the Austin police department, 346 and ourselves. And in that document it talks about our responsibility to run the 347

348fraud hotline for the city, and to conduct investigations related to fraud, waste349and abuse.

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Moving forward into our investigative process. See, our investigative process always starts with the receipt of allegations. And we have a number of sources of those allegations. As I stated the fraud, waste and abuse bulletin requires us to run the fraud hotline, and our fraud hotline program, so to speak, is made up of an actual phone line, where we receive calls, and an online reporting form, that is accessible from the city's website, and it's there for citizens and employees alike to submit allegations of fraud, waste or abuse or any wrongdoing for that matter, and they can do so anonymously.

- We also receive a number of allegations from departments, which is the department referral section, we also receive department referrals from the other side of our own department, the audit services side, who will go out and conduct planned audits related to city programs, city functions, city departments, they may stumble upon fraud, waste and abuse and refer that over to us.
- 367 And finally there's direct contact, and the reason that we always highlight 368 direct contact separate from any of these other sections, is twofold. One, we consider direct contact as a situation where an individual is not reporting 369 370 through the hotline, maybe they are aware of our office, maybe they've called the hotline before and they feel comfortable with us, they don't feel the need 371 to remain anonymous so they'll contact us directly. And it's separate from a 372 373 department referral, in that it's an individual lodging of a concern on their own 374 accord, as opposed to a division in a particular department that is referring the 375 matter for us to deal with. 376
- 377 Moving from the allegation receipt, we go into allegation triage, and there's two big buckets here. Non-fraud, waste and abuse issues, and fraud, waste and 378 379 abuse issues. As I stated earlier our area of responsibility is fraud, waste and abuse. I'm going to start with non-fraud, waste and abuse. For non-fraud, 380 waste and abuse issues we refer them to the appropriate authority, and this 381 382 could be any one of a number of entities. First, we'll refer operational issues to management. So if we receive a concern from an employee about a particular 383 procedure, or an operational decision that is purely an operational issue, we're 384 going to refer that to the appropriate department director, and we always copy 385 the applicable assistant city manager, as well as the city manager, and human 386 resources director on all of these referrals. 387 388

Human resources: we receive a number of concerns related to personnel matters that I would separate from fraud, waste and abuse, as in it's purely a personnel issue. Something along the lines of a hostile work environment, an unfair hiring practice, discrimination, so on and so forth; we refer those to human resources. 398The Austin Police Department handles criminal matters, as outlined in the
fraud, waste and abuse bulletin. We've had issues where a pool house was
broken into, the cash register was broken, and the money taken out of the cash
register was stolen. So that's something that is purely a criminal issue. While it
is theft and fraud and includes that, it's more of a physical issue, and that's
what APD's going to investigate.

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- 405 And then third party. We spend a lot of time trying to make sure that people know how to contact us, putting our information on the hotline program out 406 407 there, and as a result people from all over the country find us, and call in 408 complaints completely unrelated to the city, but we often get complaints from citizens about concerns they have that are maybe related to fraud, they just 409 don't involve the city of Austin. And as a service to those citizens, we make 410 sure that we try to point them in the right direction. We refer a lot of concerned 411 citizens to the consumer complaint division of the Attorney General's office. 412 413 Some people confuse the county with the city, so we refer people to the 414 county, and a number of different entities.
- 416 Moving over to fraud, waste and abuse issues. We don't necessarily 417 investigate every single complaint that is potential fraud, waste and abuse that 418 we receive. We do what's called preliminary inquiry, and that's the use of non-419 invasive techniques to establish predication.
- 421 Predication we define as the reasonable basis to believe the allegation may be 422 true. And when I say non-invasive, if I were being investigated I might 423 consider it invasive, but what we're saying is we're not going into the department, we're not interviewing a number of different employees from a 424 425 particular division or workgroup, we're trying to see what information we can find through files without upsetting the operations of the city. So if we have 426 access to a personnel database or to another database of information that can 427 428 help us establish with predication without involving interviews and stopping 429 operation, we use those techniques. 430
- 431 If we don't establish predication, there's a couple of different things that can 432 happen. We can close the matter out; it may not even warrant a referral. If we 433 do establish, if we do confirm that there is a concern or a risk, but it's not 434 predication for significant fraud, waste or abuse, we will refer it to the 435 appropriate authority. This is kind of a convoluted issue to describe, so let me 436 give you an example. 437
- If we received an allegation of payroll fraud, that a particular employee was stealing money using the time keeping system, and when we used our preliminary inquiry process to look into it, we determined that they were leaving 15-20 minutes early from work, not stealing thousands of dollars, technically that's a violation, it's a misuse of city resources, but it's a de minimis violation, so we're going to refer that to the department to handle

447from an operational perspective, as opposed to conducting a full-fledged448investigation.

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For those investigations that we do establish predication, we then open an investigation. And all of our investigations follow standards. This is a mouthful, the Council of the Inspector General on Integrity and Efficiency, and they issue of a number of different quality standards. One body of which is the Quality Standards of Investigations, and these standards address objectivity, integrity, competence of investigators, proper investigation planning, record keeping and performance measure tracking for investigations, a whole host of issues related to an investigative entity. And we follow those standards.

- 460 So in line with those standards we begin with objective investigation planning. We try to establish what is the crux of the issue, what are the potential 461 applicable policies, and how can we conduct an investigation in a manner that 462 is going to yield evidence or information that will support, or not support, that 463 allegation. Then we move from there into field work, which includes a wide 464 variety of investigative techniques, we conduct a lot of interviews, we do a lot 465 of document requests and analysis, online research, we've done GPS analysis 466 467 so on and so forth. 468
- 469 Investigative results. There are three possible results at the end of an 470 investigation. The first one is substantiated. That means that we substantiated the allegation. The allegation was accurate at least to some degree, and we 471 472 issue a report in that situation. Those reports are public documents, although our work papers are not, as I described earlier. Not substantiated is where we 473 find evidence or information that suggests the allegation was completely 474 untrue, and we generally do not issue a report in those circumstances. There is 475 one exception that we engaged in a couple of times. If the allegation is very 476 public, if it has been covered by the media before our investigation is 477 478 complete, and we find evidence that yields the allegation not substantiated, 479 and we have an opportunity to exonerate the individual, we will talk to the 480 department director and the employee, or whoever it may be, to determine 481 whether or not they would prefer a public report in this situation to help address the matter. And we've issued a report under those circumstances 482 483 twice. 484
 - And then the final result is inconclusive. This is where there's not enough evidence, or the evidence doesn't yield enough information to arrive at a conclusion, and we will not issue a report when our cases are inconclusive.
 - For those that are substantiated, this is our reporting information. The image on the right is pretty small, you can't read that, but I think you all have seen a copy of our report before. They are addressed to the applicable decision maker, and the decision maker is going to vary, depending on the person, or persons, involved in the investigation. Most often it's an employee and the respective department director.

497 We report to the Mayor and council and to city management, so all of our 498 reports are sent to Mayor and Council. And we include in our CC list city 499 managers, all assistant city managers and the Public Information Office, 500 because they are public documents. We include other parties, as necessary, depending on investigations. If there's a related board or commission that 501 should be aware of this information, we'll copy them on it. If it involves an 502 503 employee, and there's a potential disciplinary action resulting from our 504 investigation, then we'll copy the human resources department. We've copied 505 law on situations where there's been a legal issue, those types of situations. 506 507 Accountability action. Accountability action is any type of action that is taken subsequent to our investigation, in response to the information produced in our 508 report. Disciplinary action, removal from a specific position, restitution, 509 sometimes it's criminal prosecution and investigation. We don't make any 510 recommendations as far as the accountability action that should, or should not, 511 512 be taken in a particular situation. If the decision maker asks us what we think

- be taken in a particular situation. If the decision maker asks us what we think should happen, we let them know that we're the fact finders in the situation, that they are the decision makers, that if we have similar reports or investigations that have been produced in the past, that might be helpful, we'll provide that information to them, and we'll do an evidence review session with them if they need more details on the matter, but we won't make recommendations on the accountability action.
- 520 And finally, that is how we hope to arrive at an improved ethical environment. This is just one segment of the city's ethic structure, I can't reiterate enough 521 522 the fraud, waste and abuse bulletin identifies a number of investigative 523 authorities. There is overlap in the responsibilities for investigations, and variations in how other investigative authorities conduct their investigations, 524 or run their investigative process. The easiest variation to identify is 525 anonymity, we're the only party in the City that provides for anonymity, I 526 527 suspect because we are charged with running the fraud hotline, and I think 528 that's the reason why we get a lot of calls that are unrelated to things we need to investigate, but people find a lot of comfort and security in being able to 529 530 lodge a complaint without putting their name to paper, and everyone knowing 531 what they said. 532

So that's the conclusion to my presentation. I can take any questions that you might have.

538KaplanI'm sure the commissioners would like to ask questions. What I'd like to do539here, is just have, we don't usually do this you all, but just moving for this540meeting, such a big meeting, so many folks here, I'd like to have you ask for541recognition from the Chair, and we'll take it that way so we make sure542everybody gets a chance to speak.543

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544What I'd like to do is have the commissioners first post questions to545Mr. Hadvai, and then what we'll do after we're done here, is we'll open up the546next group of agenda items together, and have public comment on those items.

- 547 So, why don't we get started with the commissioners? Does anyone want to 548 start the questions? Commissioner Einhorn? 549 550 Einhorn In your report you recited chapter 2-3-5 of the City code, section G, talks about when an auditor determines a city employee or official that may have violated 551 552 a law, or maybe reasonably anticipated to commit a violation the auditor shall, 553 and it states that you all shall immediately report the suspected violation to the 554 appropriate authority. I'm just wondering what you think the appropriate authority with regards to an ethics violation. 555 556 557 Hadvai I'm glad you asked. In discussions with the management integrity committee, 558 which includes the city attorney, we worked on that piece of our responsibility significantly, and the advice we have been given has been when we're in a 559 560 situation where, when we make a determination that an employee has committed a criminal violation, that is the part of our city code that is 561 triggered. So for example, the payroll fraud example I gave earlier, if we 562 confirm that somebody was using the payroll system to embezzle money, it's 563 obviously going to be a criminal violation, we consult the city attorney and 564 then subsequently queue the district attorney and the Austin Police 565 Department. If it was a federal issue that involved HUD, for example, we 566 567 would consider HUD to be the appropriate authority. But for general situations of fraud, waste and abuse where it's not a criminal violation, or where the 568 569 relative authority has declined to take on the issue, we handle it through our 570 normal investigation process. 571 572 Einhorn How many conflict of interest investigations has the auditor's office undertaken in the past five years? 573 574
- 575 Hadvai
 576 I couldn't tell you off the top of my head. Are you asking for investigations where we substantiated violations, or are you asking just in general?
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578 Einhorn Both.

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- 580HadvaiI'd have to get back to you on numbers. I don't want to give you false581numbers, but several.
- 583EinhornOkay. I looked around on the auditor's website, and I understand that your584website is in the process of being redone, which it seems the city of Austin's585website is constantly in process of being redone. I'm just wondering where the586public can go on the web, on the internet to find these reports? Are they posted587on the internet for the public to access?
- 589 Hadvai They are not posted on the internet.590
- 591 Einhorn How would the public know that they exist?
- 592593Hadvai594Well, it depends on which member of the public. So anyone involved in an
investigation can call, we frequently get follow up phone calls or
communications, sometimes we get e-mails from people that have participated
in an investigation and want to know what the result was. We have at times

597 598 599 600 601		received blanket requests, so I would consider it a public information request, of someone periodically submits a request for all investigation reports for a period of time, or involvement with the City department for a certain period of time.
602 603 604 605	Einhorn	Is there a process for the subject of an investigation to be notified when the report of an investigation is done? Do they get a chance to see it before it's published, and respond to it?
606 607 608 609 610 611 612	Hadvai	That would be up to the applicable decision maker. So one thing I didn't talk about with is our report system, prior to the issuance of a report we provide a draft copy a week in advance to the applicable decision maker, and if they want to share that with the person involved in the investigation, that is up to them. We report our findings to the decision makers. If they want to involve the person involved in the investigation, then that's their prerogative.
612 613 614 615	Kaplan	Any further questions from the commissioner? I have a question - are we allowed to know who the decision maker was in this instance?
616 617 618	Hadvai	Yes, so we looked at the appointing council member, which was council member Martinez.
619 620	McCormick	I have a question.
620 621 622	Kaplan	Commissioner McCormick?
622 623 624 625 626 627	McCormick	Commissioner Einhorn asked a similar question. In your distribution list you have the Director of Communications and Public Information. So this is going out to the world, possibly before the person being investigated knows about it. Is that correct?
628 629 630 631 632	Hadvai	I wouldn't say it's going out to the world. We make them aware of it, we provide them a copy; we don't provide it to any media outlets or send it out to anybody. We provide it to them in the event that a public information request is received later on.
632 633 634 635 636 637 638	McCormick	So you do not know who the Director of Communications and Public Information, when they send it out, or how they send it out, how fast, after this was dated April the 18 th ?
639 640 641 642	Hadvai	It is my understanding that they don't just send it out. That they have a copy, a courtesy copy if you will, in the event that a public information request comes in. So it's not a pushing it out, it's making it available to them so that if requests come in for the report they have it.
643 644 645 646	McCormick	But you don't know really who it goes to? From the Director of Communications and Public Information, you don't know anything about their list? And whether they send it to the newspaper? As it seems that they do.

647 648 649 650 651	Hadvai	When a public information request comes in it gets logged in a city system, that staff in our office has access to, so we become aware of the public information request. If somebody provides it to somebody outside of that process, then no, we don't know.
652 653 654	Ken Mory	We're not aware – I'm Ken Mory, City Auditor - we're not aware of them actually releasing it to anybody else.
655 656	McCormick	Well it seems like they do.
657 658 659	Kaplan	I'd just like to take a moment to thank Mr. Mory for being with us today, thank you.
660 661	Price	I have two questions.
662 663	Kaplan	Okay.
664 665 666 667	Price	I'm not going to limit myself to two. One is on the reason - one of the reasons why we have so many people visiting is - you said you sent it to distribution, but the person being investigated wasn't on the distribution list.
668 669	Hadvai	Correct.
670 671	Price	So she, or her representative, never got this, and why is that?
672 673 674 675 676 676 677 678	Hadvai	Our process, I think I articulated poorly earlier. Our process if focused on reporting our results to the decision makers and to the bodies that we report to, that's the Mayor and council, and the respective decision maker in any given situation. Whether they choose to involve the person involved in the investigation or not, is truly in their own court, if you will, we don't make any recommendations on how they handle it, that's not part of our process.
679 680 681 682 683 684	Price	So generally, not generally, but exclusively, when you are investigating a claim against an individual - I'm not going to talk about a corporation or a company - an individual, that individual is being investigated no matter what the determination is, that individual is never notified of your findings, unless the decision maker, or whoever you guys decide, tells that person?
685 686	Hadvai	Correct.
687 688 689	Price	And that is based on this standard, the national standards, that's how they do it?
690 691 692 693 694 695 696	Hadvai	Well, the standards has flexibility in the reporting. It requires for verbal reports, which we don't provide. We only provide written reports, we don't do anything verbally. I don't think they've reached that level of detail. They don't set out the actual policies and procedures, they provide guidance for standards issued, which we seek to reach out too during the investigation. The confidence of investigators, a system by which you track your investigations, these types of issues.

697 698 699	Price	And this is separate from the particular reason why we are, that's on our agenda, but just in general about the auditor's office. Who audits the auditor?
700 701 702 703 704 705 706 707 708	Hadvai	Other auditors. We are required by government auditing standards to undergo a peer review every three years. The peer review is done, we're part of an association, it's called ALGA, the Association of Local Government Auditors, and we participate in their peer review process where every three years they send a team of auditors from different shops to come in and evaluate our practices, and look at how we conduct various projects, and then they issue a report for lack of a better term, they issue and present a letter to the audit finance committee and talk about our office.
709 710 711	Price	So they usually send it to the city council members who are sitting on the city audit finance committee?
712 713	Hadvai	Yes ma'am.
714 715 716 717	Price	Okay. Then you said that sometimes you have a, you issue a report, well no, my notes are really bad, that if you find to some degree that the complaint is substantiated, then I guess
718 719 720 721	Hadvai	What I was trying to communicate there was we may receive a host of allegations, and let's say that three of the four turned out to be substantiated, but the fourth did not, so we'll issue a report for those three.
722 723 724 725 726	Price	Okay, well I'm a lawyer and so we always have this, maybe some people call it, I'm sure jurors would call a very wishy-washy standard, which is a burden of proof. What is the level that you guys need to meet in order to find that something's substantiated? I'm very confused about it.
727 728 729 730	Hadvai	A preponderance of evidence. When I was talking about when we would issue a report, I wasn't talking about the level of evidence, I was talking about often times an allegation is not just one straight forward issue.
731 732	Price	Oh, that was not clear. So if there's several issues
733 734	Hadvai	We'll report on the ones that we substantiated and not the others.
735 736 737 738 739	Price	Okay. Then the greater weight and degree of the credible evidence, that is when you find the allegation has been substantiated. Okay. And then my only other question, you said if it's not substantiated then there's no report, most of the time.
740 741	Hadvai	Correct.
742 743 744 745	Price	So the person who's being investigated, who may know they're being investigated, will never get a written document saying that you guys did not, that there was no support for it.

746 747 748 749 750 751 752	Hadvai	That's correct. We have a, we include in our process, we try to protect the identities of witnesses and informants, and so we're balanced with what information we're putting out there. And we're also, if someone did not do what was alleged, that they did not perform that action or that event did not take place, we don't want to present a public report that ties them to that action, because people are just going to associate them with that, regardless of what our finding is stating.
753 754 755 756	Price	So is it your position any findings you guys write out and issue to a decision maker is public record?
757 758 759	Hadvai	Correct, our reports have to be public record. The Public Information Act, the portion that addresses the exemption for audit working papers does not protect reports at all, it only protects working papers.
760 761	Price	Okay, I think I'm done.
762 763 764 765 766 766 767 768	Einhorn	I think you addressed this in your presentation, but I just want to make sure I fully understand it. What is the force in effect of the investigation report from the auditor's integrity unit? I mean, does the report constitute a finding or determination that a violation has occurred, or does it just highlight an allegation, and a potential allegation, to be further investigated by the appropriate authority?
769 770 771 772	Hadvai	The report documents our conclusions, our findings, so it's not a court of law but it's not merely an allegation.
772 773 774	Kaplan	Any questions from any other commissioners?
775 776 777	Einhorn	And so when you present the report to the decision maker, then it's the decision maker's responsibility to take further action or no action at all?
778 779	Hadvai	I wouldn't say responsibility.
780 781	Einhorn	Or option.
782 783	Hadvai	Correct. So action's not always taken as a result of our investigation.
784 785 786 787 788 789 790 791 792 793 794 795	Kaplan	Any additional questions or discussion? I'd like to take a couple to share my few cents, I guess. I don't know if I speak for all of us, but I'll speak for myself, and say obviously I'm disappointed that we can't find out more about this particular investigation using this forum, I know that the ZWAC was disappointed when you all addressed the ZWAC for the same thing, but I understand that the PIA keeps your working papers private, I think any additional information that you all are at liberty to share, able to share, helps sheds a little bit of light on this discussion, which has been going on vigorously of course, in the public ever since the report was issued. I want to highlight, you know, there certainly is an irony here that we have an anonymous complaint, and we still don't know who made the complaint

796 against a very non-anonymous commissioner. All of us are commissioners, we 797 all serve because we care about the city, and we love to do what we do for as 798 long as we can. And we're unpaid, we just do this because we care, and we'd 799 like to make the city a little bit better. And I'd like to think that every city 800 commissioner, and there are lots of them, and there are going to be even more 801 of them after 10-1, everyone's in it for the same reason. And part of what we 802 do here is to try to make life as straight forward and as easy as possible for City Commissioners, and also kind of give them the rules of the road, and it's 803 804 a concern when people can make anonymous complaints against city 805 commissioners, and people feel like their rights are...they're not able to 806 vindicate their rights in public. And I understand that concern. So in trying to address this moving forward -807 808

- 809 If I may, I think another side of that, if the person is not guilty and it's made Mory public, in our society quite often they're guilty and so the reputation can be, I 810 811 mean y'alls reputation, you can just make an allegation and just throw it out there. We need to protect not only our witness but I think also we need to have 812 some protection for a person from having an allegation made against them. So 813 814 that's, and we're subject to the same thing, I will guarantee you I've been accused of a few things in my career, and luckily, they were not substantiated 815 816 for the most part, have never been substantiated, and I was glad that it just 817 didn't become public knowledge. And especially at y'alls level and at the City 818 management level and people with high visibility jobs, it's important we look at all things and balance it so everybody's reputation and rights is protected, so 819 this is what we do in order to do that. And the idea is if they're not 820 substantiated it will never get out. So I think that's some assurance, if you're 821 822 not guilty of it, it's not gonna get out. I think part of the solution for Commissioner's is, I think we do have a rule book, we just need to look at it, 823 is the training, the education, make sure all the commissioners are very clear, 824 what they can and can't do. That's probably the best thing, because it's 825 826 preventative. You end up with no problems at the end of the day.
- 828 Kaplan I just want to add one more point and then I'll defer to you, Commissioner 829 Einhorn. If - what's your position - and thank you again to Mr. Mory and Mr. 830 Hadvai for being with us tonight, I appreciate it. What's your position, if the Ethics Commission were to suggest to council that the Ethics Commission 831 832 should have exclusive jurisdiction over allegations of conflicts of interest, and 833 lobbyists with respect to commissioners, so folks like us, people that are sitting on these public boards and they run into these issues, distinguishing 834 835 commissioners from city employees, people who are paid by the city. So do 836 you have an opinion on that, whether or not you would agree? How do I put 837 it? Do you have an opinion if the Ethics Commission were to make that 838 suggest to council that the Ethics Commission should be the place to go if you 839 have a complaint against a sitting commissioner? 840

Hadvai
I don't have an opinion on that in general. My only caution that I would communicate would be, as frustrating as the anonymous portion is, we get a lot of calls from people that want to make complaints, I can't tell you how many times myself, or my investigators, have referred someone to the Ethics Review Commission process, and the putting their name to paper and being

846publicly associated with that complaint is a fearful practice for them, and so847they choose to refer it to us instead. So what I would do is, I would848recommend if you go down that path that you at least consider some form of849anonymous reporting.

851 Kaplan I appreciate that.

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853 Mr. Hadvai, in trying to learn a little bit about the city auditor's integrity unit, I Einhorn found in your accomplishment report in 2013 a little statement that says, 'city 854 855 auditor's integrity unit conducted several integrity related projects. Through these projects the CAIU helped improve ethics city wide by maintaining a 856 visible integrity system, and ensuring compliance with applicable policies, 857 laws and regulations.' But based on everything you guys have said, it doesn't 858 seem all that visible. And I agree with you, I understand the need to have an 859 anonymous reporting process, and I definitely think that is something that we 860 need to address, but 2-7 of the city code makes a pretty clear process for a 861 visible ethics compliance process. It is a process where we have open 862 deliberation, everyone has access to everything we do, they can come and hear 863 us deliberate on it, and you know, I am troubled by the word 'visible process', 864 865 when it doesn't appear to be a particularly visible process.

- 866 867 Hadvai Well we engage in a lot of activities internal to the city that other people don't 868 see. We participate in the development and the implementation of annual 869 ethics training. We work very closely with the ethics compliance teams. We talk about what are the trends and issues that are coming up, what are the 870 871 things that it seems like employees are not getting, or are particularly having struggles with, we participate in the supervisors and manager's academy, 872 which is part of our orientation development academies. And we talk about the 873 ethic structure as a whole, we talk about the other investigative authorities, we 874 talk about the resources that are available to them, the processes that are 875 876 available to them, we make sure that people coming in are aware of the 877 applicable policies and procedures, administrative bulletins of the city code, we do the same for new employee orientation. And there's a number of other 878 things we do along those lines that help maintain the visibility of the integrity 879 880 system which you guys play a very major role, I'm familiar with the role that you play, and the process that you guys follow, but there's also a human 881 resources element, a police department element, a management integrity 882 element, ethics compliance, there's multiple pieces to the City's ethics that 883 884 exist within the structure that come together, sometimes overlap, and build up 885 the ethical environment that is the City of Austin. That includes management, 886 the tone that they set, during their day to day operations. 887
- Speight When it became clear that it was a conflict of interest complaint, was there any ability on y'alls part to forward to it to us, before you all engaged in an investigation? Understanding that it was an anonymous complaint, is there, going forward, a method for us to do it together? Any means for that?

895 Hadvai If I could address just the second part, I can't speak about the details of this particular investigation. From a process standpoint, there's been no precedent 896 for that. That's certainly an option, something to discuss, we don't have any 897 898 advice or direction from our law department, for example, or any other 899 department that that's the process that should be followed or any authority that 900 says this is the way it should be handled, but I'm not saying that that couldn't 901 be part of the process going forward. That, or what you were talking about 902 earlier, related to separating city official from city employees, and the way that 903 they're handled with respect to ethics issues. I think that either one of those 904 are realistic possibilities. 905

- 906 Kaplan And I'll address that briefly. It seems to be me if we're both doing the same 907 thing, so we came to the realization that we're both on parallel tracks, but it 908 seems to me to be somewhat inefficient to have us both do the same thing. 909 Certainly 2-7 sets out our rules and those rules are published, and everybody knows the rules of the road with respect to that stuff, and that's kind of what 910 we do. But certainly we don't want to be handling 2-7 complaints that are HR 911 issues for city, for city employees. That's not what we do. And we struggle to 912 913 make sure people understand that distinction as well. But that aside, I think for 914 city officials who are appointed who serve publicly and are subject to the rules 915 we oversee, it seems to me to make sense to have us to be the process, to have complaints go against those people, and not have an anonymous option. Not 916 917 that it's not available, but have the complaints referred to us instead. My 918 concern is that the anonymous option doesn't, for exactly what you said, people are fearful when they have to actually make a public complaint. And I 919 920 don't think that it's a bad thing when you're going to swear out a complaint 921 against someone who's a city commissioner. Because I think that it will make people think twice, and make sure they've got a good reason to bring this 922 complaint. And people have done it. You know, we have a complaint coming 923 up soon. It's already been filed. And that I won't talk about, but stay tuned. In 924 925 any event, that's the process, and there's a reason for the process, and I see 926 good reason to go through that process, and I'm concerned given what we've learned about this situation, and given, obviously, the concern behind you in 927 928 the room at the anonymous method, which none of us knew about before we 929 were alerted to this issue even existed, is a potential for abuse of the complaint process. So my personal opinion is I think moving forward we should figure 930 out a way, and maybe the hard part is just to figure out how we set that process 931 932 out, but a way that works for you all, works for us and the council agrees with, 933 so that complaints are made publicly when made against city officials. 934
- 935 Speight In that vein, it seems to me there's nothing that precludes them from filing a complaint with them, and then filing a complaint with us.
 937
- 939 Cindy Tom That's what I was thinking.
- 941SpeightThey can keep the anonymity if they so choose, but then the investigation942portion, or the review, comes to us.
- 943 944

945KaplanSo it's a way protect the anonymity of the person filing the complaint, but it946seems to me you would issue this report, and then you're going to drop it on947us without filing a complaint, and then you won't talk to us about your948investigation so that we can flesh out whether we want to take up the issue on949our own. So would you guys be in favor of maybe a change to clarify that if950you guys find a possible violation of ethics or rules that you actually file a951complaint with us?

- 953 Hadavi I think the cleaner way to do it would be earlier, and again, we report to mayor 954 and council so we would want to run it past them, but providing that we have 955 their support for this, would be to file the complaint at the allegation point, and you guys would process from beginning to end. So there's no differentiation 956 between someone coming directly to you and one step of them reporting to us. 957 958 But we haven't done any investigative work, we say we've received this 959 complaint, we're filling out this complaint form that goes to the Ethics Review 960 Commission and we're not attesting to anything in here, other than the fact we've received this information. 961
- Cindy Tom 963 I have to just interject here as legal counsel. You guys are aware, of course, 964 that under the process set out currently in chapter 2-7 for complaints and 965 hearings, generally the individual who filed the complaint does need to swear 966 to the complaint, and that person would have the burden of proof at a 967 preliminary hearing, and if we moved towards a final hearing to present the 968 evidence and witnesses to prove the allegation if the auditor's office, or someone from the auditor's office going forward, were to file a complaint with 969 970 the ERC, the expectation would be that that the office would continue to be 971 involved in the preliminary hearing.
- 973 Speight And that was my scenario.

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- 975 Cindy Tom Unless there was a change to that process made by council, or unless the 976 Ethics Review Commission were to file a complaint on its own initiative, but if so, I think one of the challenges is that the Ethics Review Commission's full 977 978 time staff, well consists of me, I'm not full time with you all, and I'm not an 979 investigator, and it might be difficult without anything else from the auditor, with no investigation, with no kind of plaintiff presenting the case for you, for 980 981 you guys to try to come up with the facts on your own, when you're a part 982 time volunteer commission. It just might present logistical challenges under 983 the current code, under the current process. 984
- 985 Speight And the scenario I was referring to would have kept them involved in the process.
 987
- Kaplan
 Kaplan
 I have a question for our staff liaison Cindy Tom, from the law department.
 Can the auditor under our current rules, do we know if an auditor can swear
 out a complaint and then take that advocate role in the process, the
 complainant's role? That may be something we need to clarify.
- 993 Cindy Tom I don't see any restriction, at least in chapter 2-7. I'm not sure about the 994 auditor's own policies, or the auditor's own code, the chapter 2-7 in the city

995		code which governs Ethics Review Commission complainant hearing process
996		states any person can file a complaint – an ethics complaint. It does need to be
997		sworn, that's part of code. It does need to list the section that was violated, list
998		some facts, summarize some evidence or witnesses that might be presented to
999		prove it. But, there's no restriction against city staff filing a complaint with the
1000		Ethics Review Commission that I'm aware of.
1000		
1001	Kaplan	I would be more in favor of that than having us as part of the revision to the

1194I represent to all of you that in putting these agenda items on the agenda our1195attempt was to give this commission as much power as it has to act given the1196facts before it. So we are limited as a commission to what we can do, we1197attempted with this agenda to try give us as much leeway to do whatever the1198commission decides to do that it can do. That was out intent here.

1200 So I want to let you all know this is how the speakers go. Daniela Ochoa Gonzalez, Brandi Clark, Ken Schroeder Stacy Guidry, I hope I'm saying that 1201 right, sorry Stacy. Heidi Harris, Gail Vittori, Morgan Whitney, Iyam Nyick, 1202 who's donating time, I apologize. - 1230 Clark I didn't expect to go first, but thank you for having us. My name is Brandi Clark Burton and I serve on multiple boards and commissions, and I have 1231 chaired commissions in the past, and I am very involved with this city. I'm 1232 also very involved in the zero waste movement, and have attended ZWAC 1233 1234 meetings, and also personally know Daniela Ochoa. When I found out about 1235 the allegations and the report was released I read the report. I could not 1236 understand the substantiation that was put forth, and I went to ask Daniela 1237 many more questions, and felt like she gave every effort from the time she was been asked us to serve on the commission. She said "is it okay - I'm working 1238 for a waste hauler - for me to serve on this commission?" She was told yes. 1239 There was something where a vote was coming up, that there was going to be 1240 a financial benefit to help you, before the need to recuse yourself. 1241 1242

1243		And she asked for that clarification again, and she was trying to make sure,
1244		she was going to say no if it was a problem, she didn't want to cause anybody
1245		any problem. And she asked when the training was given, the ethics training
1246		was given, she said, 'is this available in Spanish? I want to make sure that I
1247		understand this, like exactly what it meant'.
1248		
1249		And I think that as we become a more diverse city that out ethics training
1250		needs to be available in Spanish. Even though meetings are conducted in
1250		English, the understanding of the nuance of the legal facts should be clear to
1251		everybody in their native language.
1252		everybody in their native language.
1255		And furthermore, I think that, I just hope that you will take action. Whatever
1254		
		action you have the power to do to dismiss this report, and to change the
1256		process. I got from your, from listening to their testimony, that you guys want
1257		a fair and transparent process. You want to honor the service of
1258		commissioners, and make this be as transparent and fair as possible. I don't
1259		want to take more time, there's a lot of people waiting to speak, but thank you
1260		for the opportunity to be here, and I believe that Daniela is innocent. In
1261		knowing her passion, and wanting to go back to Mexico and basically be like
1262		the Bob Gedert of her, you know, territory, an ethics violation that does not
1263		reflect the intention of her service here in America is not fair, I don't believe.
1264		And I hope that we can do whatever we can to remove that.

1280		And especially thankful that these, that this will set a precedent, so that there is
1281		a precedent to make it easier for all commissioners in the future.
1282		a procedent to make it custor for an commissioners in the future.
1285		I wanted to tell personally how the situation was for me. It's not like I'm
1284		trying to learn English still. I graduated from a Master program in the United
1285		States, and English is something I feel very proficient about. I took the
1280		training of ethics three times, because there is a chance to repeat it. I also read
1287		
1288		the ethics code, and the ethics guidelines, because I did call and ask for it in Spanish, and sure as long as you completely understand the guidelines. Make
1290 1291		sure you know them perfectly, so I review them and have no questions.
1271		

What I did, I did as the director of the department, I was gratified that it was not a problem. So I was with my clear mind, thinking I was making a difference, spending three hours of my time, and taking another ten hours to read the 250 pages as you have to review every agenda item and supporting document, reading the document in English was better than Grad school, you know, understanding everything, learning all the terminology and trying to provide my time there.

- 1300I was appointed, at least I was appointed because there weren't that many1301people in the Hispanic community that actually care about issues that are1302related to waste reduction, and they couldn't find anyone that was more1303passionate about this than me. So I thought that was a good opportunity to1304have this learning opportunity and when it came, I really felt that when I went1305to sleep, and I still do today, that I come out clean.
- So that was in January when I started, and back in December 2013, after almost a year of that, I got a call from Mister Nathan Willy, who by the way is here today, and I appreciate that you gave the time and have the interest to come here, and Miss Tucker, who are part of the investigator unit from the auditor. And I was told in English, we had a phone call saying that you had a wrongdoing. A wrong doing? I was like what am I doing wrong? Can you explain what wrongdoing means? Well, we have to make an interview with you if you don't mind.
- 1316I call right away and say 'yes, let's do it as soon as possible'. I went there with1317my three month old baby, I couldn't find a babysitter, in a tiny room like the1318policeman play with a lamp, and they asked me all these questions and they1319record me, and I look at them like in a normal situation I give my best. I am1320like whatever is needed here, I'm in the clear. I have no wrongdoing.
- 1322And they went through the questionnaire in late December. I notified the1323office of Mike Martinez and they told me not to worry about it, as long as you1324are clear, you're clean, right? I'm absolutely clean. Then let them do the1325process, the process will most likely find you not substantiated, and that will1326be it.
 - I never heard anything more about it in 2013 until I got a phone call on April 22nd from Andrew Morris saying 'Ms. Daniela, we're going to need you to resign from your position'. And I said, 'why, why?' 'There is this report. Remember that interview you had back in late December? Well a report has been issued that says you have a conflict of interest and I'm sorry to tell you, but I'm going to have to ask you to resign'.
 - And I said 'well, can I see the report?' 'Well, I guess if you must, but can you just tell me right now on the phone that you will resign?' And I said, 'well, I don't know much about legal process in this country, but I think it's at least like when you sign a contract, I would like to read the report before I tell you this, so I totally understand what I am being accused of'. He said 'okay I will send you the report if you must do that. But make sure that you respond to me with an e-mail saying that you resign as soon as possible'.

1342So I send an e-mail to Mr. Richoff, who is the chair of ZWAC, and a couple1343other friends saying, 'what do you think of this? How do I go about it?' And1344he responded in a very ethical and professional way saying, 'for the note, I'm1345not your attorney, I'm not giving you legal advice on this matter but, I think1346you should resign'.

So I said, 'well you know, I was raised Catholic in a developing country where you're supposed to nod your head and obey. I have never even perceived that when someone tells you to resign that you have the option to not resign. You know, so they had believed in me, they wanted me to represent my community, but they don't want me anymore. And in addition my chair tells me this, well I go ahead and resign.

- 1355Now I know it wasn't the best decision because if I had the report, I would be1356able to prove that I am innocent. And to also prove that there is a better way to1357come out and participate in the commissioner process without feeling this fear.1358Because what I felt was a lot of fear. I don't feel fear anymore. I believe in1359democracy in this country and I have been very impressed by the commitment1360that the Zero Waste Advisory Commission has, by the commitment this board1361has, and by the commitment of the people that know me in this community.
 - I think I probably donated more than two hundred hours a year of volunteer work, in addition to my work with the city as a composter. And I just, I believe I was born to be serving to be an environmental steward in the world. All my life I have done this, whether it has been as a public servant, whether it has been a public employee, whether it has been a private employee. Now I cannot do it anymore unless this is fixed. Because it is a stain, like the scarlet stain, I really feel like that. I always look at it like a stain; that that's the way I feel.
 - So if you can help me with a resolution being approved, I know it's not like a jury, and it's not 'not-guilty', but ultimately this nation and this city is for the people, by the people, and the zero waste goals, and everything is for the betterment of all of us, right? So for me it's important enough to use it in the resolution, that it's not only me going cuckoo, it is your clear mind that there were some facts there that make no sense, and that there is no direct economic effect, and that there could be a precedent for this loophole in the system, to be fixed. And if happened that I was a guinea pig for it, yes, maybe my career has to take backlash for now, but at least if this resolution passes my life can move on.
- 1382Because there is a lot of money, and money even for the employees in the city,1383and time and resources and energy that has been devoted to this issue, that1384could have been devoted to more productive things. That's my personal1385belief. I think I'll stop right there.1386
- 1387Another very important point about this process is that I believe other people1388will learn tonight. So thank you, and thank you for your attention.1389
- 1390 Kaplan Hold on, before you take off, there may a question, Ms. Gonzalez.
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1392	Einhorn	Yes, I have one question. Are you referring to the Ethics Review Commission
1393		resolution that we have - the three page resolution on this matter?

1401		we're busy providing for our families, and trying to make a difference out in
1402		the world, in addition with providing to the city. The city is busy, the city has
1403		more boards and commitments than people have time.

1422		me to work for their benefit, because I have always been known to speak my
1423		mind. Whoever knows me has to deal with my always speaking my mind,
1424		that's the problem that I have. If we do have to advise something ethically and
1425		diplomatically speaking, no commissioner, no citizen should feel afraid to
1426		speak their mind. So I don't want this to be like, 'oh, you're speaking your
1427		mind, you know what's going to happen to you? What happened to that

- 1442EinhornAnd when we spoke to you last time, you mentioned that when addressing the1443potential conflicts of interest you talked to somebody from Austin Resource1444Recovery. On the last page of this document it says that if you have any1445questions you can contact the city of Austin Integrity Officer. Did you ever1446contact the Integrity Office and ask any questions about the potential conflicts1447of interest?
- 1449 Gonzalez No I didn't because when I met with Bob Gedert, back in February 2013, 1450 before any of the time I was working there. So before I even had any question of any conflict, they address me. They called me to address that I might have a 1451 conflict of interest, because I used to teach composting for the city. So before 1452 there was anything foreseen as a conflict, even any agenda, they sat me in the 1453 1454 office and said, 'as long as you stay clear that you have nothing to do with any decision making of any company involved with this, that you're only focusing 1455 on education or translation, you're doing your training and you are not talking 1456 1457 on behalf or benefiting any company, you're gonna be clean'. So I said, 'I won't have to rescue myself?' And they say, 'no, because under the code 2-7-1458 1. I think, or something like that, it says that people that have an indirect 1459 1460 effect, you know like, they do not need to rescue themselves, it isn't in the city code. That's what I understood from it. 1461 1462
- 1463KaplanAlright. Any further questions from the commissioners? Okay, thank you Ms.1464Ochoa Gonzalez. It was good to see you again.
- 1466 Whellan I'm happy to answer your question. Michael Whellan on behalf -

I1477served at one time on the civil rights commission in another city, in that sector.1478And I know Daniela from my time, or our time together, serving the extension1479service as master gardeners. So I do know something, now I know even more,1480seeing this enthusiasm and energy. She is an energetic and active proponent of1481the environment.
- 1483The thing that I come today for this, is I'm really troubled by this whole1484business and due process. I understand the need for some kind of anonymous1485information. But I also understand that there comes a time even for an1486anonymous accuser, or an anonymous donor, that when it really gets tough,1487somebody's got to stand forward. Because Daniela, or anybody else, has a1488constitutional right to face an accuser.
- 1490I find it repellent that in this city, of all cities in the state of Texas, and the city1491in which I live, that Daniela wakes up in the morning to see this story splashed

1492 1493		on the front page of the American Statesman. Like three or four days after she has learned about the report.
1494		I
1495		And the result of that has been the tremendous loss of livelihood and training
1496		without her really having any recourse whatsoever. I don't believe that is the
1497		way we want to do business here. And when it comes down to an ethical
1498		violation, I think that this violation of her due process, and the loss of
1499		livelihood is the real ethical problem here that needs to be addressed by this
1500		group, one way or the other. Any way you can. This is wrong.

1517		Waste Alliance chapter, of which Ms. Ochoa is a member. I am also the owner
1518		of Texas Zero Waste Strategies, which helps the city help implement the
1519		universal recycling ordinates, which is the business of recycling policies. And
1520		I have known Daniela for many years, and is probably one of the most honest
1521		and most ethical people I have ever met.
1522		
1523		This process has really shined a light on some very troubling issues, and I
1524		really feel that if we want to see people from our community serve in a
1525		volunteer unpaid capacity, to serve the city of Austin, and they're experts in
1526		their fields, we can't treat them like this. It is wrong. This office has just
1527		thrown the book at Ms. Ochoa. There was no warning, there was no extra
1528		training. It was like a red card in soccer, you're out. And none of this was
1529		done to remedy the perceived violation, and I don't know if anybody is going
1530		to say it here today, but shame on Council Member Martinez, for dropping her
1531		like a hot potato, and throwing her under the bus.
1532		
1533		It may not be a violation of professional ethics for him to drop a person that he
1534		appointed personally, but talk about a violation of personal ethics, in my mind.
1535		And so, as commissioners I'm asking you, would you go to bat, for the city
1536		and serve unpaid and volunteer if you knew previously that you had been
1537		thrown under the bus, that you would not have your person, your council
1538		member that's appointing you, standing behind you on allegations like this,
1539		before you even have the chance to defend yourself? I know I wouldn't. And
1540		I've got a lot of expertise in this field. I'm a person that could serve. I
1541		wouldn't do it. I don't agree with the anonymous tips and complaints. This

1542		has allowed for a smear campaign against Daniela. She's a young professional,
1543		she's also a young mother, and she was robbed of livelihood when she was
1544		fired from UT because of this. And I would like to see the city retract this
1545		report. The city needs to apologize to her publicly, and I would love to see
1546		this resolution that has been crafted passed. Thank you.

1582		here to support the resolution proposed by the Ethics Commissions
1583		consideration and adoption.
1584		
1585		As background, I was the founding chair of the city Solid Waste Advisory
1586		Commission, and served on the commission for ten years, until 1998. SWAC,
1587		now ZWAC, prized by having its members represent various facets of the solid
1588		waste industry in addition to community stake holders. It includes service
1589		providers, people representing environmental organizations, and many others.
1590		

1591While I am not currently actively involved with ZWAC today, I imagine it1592continues to benefit from having some members who are actively involved1593with the focus of the commission, such as Daniela. These people are1594invaluable, we rely on them, we depend on them, our commissions are not1595effective without them, and I'm sure you have experienced this on your ethics1596commission.1597

- 1598This relationship does not inherently represent a conflict of interest.1599Specifically in this case, it does not establish a direct economic effect. As put1600forward in the ZWAC response to the city auditor's integrity unit report1601anonymously adopted by ZWAC members, and signed by Austin Resource1602Recovery's director, Bob Gedert. Daniela informed director Gedert two times1603of her contract with the waste hauler, was told she did not need to rescue1604herself as she just said.
- 1606That of a volunteer doing what you would imagine to be due diligence, to1607make sure you're cleared, every sense of consciousness and awareness about1608that, and guidance from the department director, should have assuaged her1609sense of whether or not she was to consider that any further. It's interesting to1610note what you mentioned about the ethics report, but again I think that Daniela1612absolutely did her due diligence in this case.

- On April 29th, I along with I'm sure many other folks who know Daniela, read 1613 the Austin American Statesman in the morning and was stunned to read of the 1614 alleged conflict of interest on the front page of the paper. It was an alarming 1615 moment to imagine what decisions lead to this public violation of due process. 1616 The action of the city auditors integrity united blast upon what the elements of 1617 integrity is. It's not in line with the principles of transparency, nor with the city 1618 that prides itself on being the best managed seat in the United States. It should 1619 prevail upon those of us who choose to serve the city as volunteer 1620 commissioners with a goal to share our knowledge and expertise, to make 1621 1622 Austin a better city. 1623
- 1624In closing I ask that you clear Daniela of any allegations associated with1625conflict of interest, within your power, retract the report, and to adopt the1626proposed resolution to ensure that such a violation of due process will never1627happen again.1628
- 1629 Kaplan Thank you. Any questions from Commissioners? Alright, thank you. Morgan
 1630 Whitney. Then next up is Teresa Holmes, Andrew Dobbs.
 1631
- 1632 My name is Morgan Whitney, thank you for the opportunity to speak today. I Whitney have never been to a meeting like this. I work in the zero waste field as well, I 1633 1634 manage federal grants, which you have federal grants to reduce waste and pollution, and I work on zero waste projects and I am also a young 1635 professional. I have gained a lot just from some of the folks in this community 1636 who are in this room and Daniela as well. She's a force. She's also bilingual, 1637 I've worked in different parts like South East Austin where the kind of work 1638 she is doing is literally opening up a whole door of possibilities for the 1639 community of Austin, and when I as well, learned about these allegations from 1640

1641 papers I was pretty floored and puzzled. I'm here today to urge you guys to 1642 pass this resolution, and also I think it's just the right thing to do, to really acknowledge and retract the statements made, and allegations listed against 1643 her, she's 100% cleared, that she's not had any financial gain from this. I just 1644 want to be short and sweet and communicate about the resolution to be passed 1645 today. Thank you so much. Any questions? 1646 1647 1648 Kaplan Alright. Thank you Ms. Whitney. Teresa Holmes I believe is next. Then 1649 Andrew Dobbs. Is Randy Jewart donating time to you, Teresa? 1650 1651 Jewart No. 1652 1653 Kaplan Okay, sorry, sorry. Teresa, Andrew then Randy. 1654 1655 Holmes I'll be short. My name is Teresa Holmes and obviously I'm here on behalf of 1656 my friend Daniela to hopefully urge you guys to clear her name and pass the resolution before you. 1657 1658 1659 I am a certified horticulturalist, master gardener, on the board of Keep Austin Beautiful. You'll notice that a lot of people here, a lot of us give our time 1660 1661 because we're passionate about helping other people, and for no other reason than that. 1662 1663 1664 To say that, it also needs to be said that Daniela makes us look lazy. Because she gives more than anybody else I've ever met. She went to a really great 1665 school, she went to Cornell, and is very educated, and she could do a lot of 1666 different things with the degree and education that she has. But she chooses, 1667 against her husband's advisements, probably wishes to take a job where you 1668 get pretty little money. But she does it, and I her why one day, and she said she 1669 does it because she just wants to be a public servant, because that's what her 1670 life is about, and that is her life goal. To have this happen to her makes me 1671 1672 very emotional because it's so unfair the way this process has unfolded, and I just hope that there's some visibility, like you said, that comes out of this. And 1673 to prove further know how passionate she is about this, whenever this has all 1674 1675 been happening and she asked me to come to this, and she said that even if her name wasn't cleared she wants to make the change in this process so 1676 something like this doesn't happen to somebody else. 1677 1678 1679 So I think that speaks very highly of her. That's it. 1680 Kaplan Thank you. Any questions? 1681 1682 1683 Mister Dobbs? Next up Randy Jewart, then Saul Sussman. 1684 1685 Dobbs Good evening, Commissioners. My name is Andrew Dobbs, and I'm the program director with Texas Campaign for the Environment. 1686 1687 1688 I'm here today, because not only is Daniela one of our communities foremost experts on zero waste, especially on compost, she's a vital part of the 1689 environmental community here, and has been a tremendous servant, as you've 1690

1691 heard. We feel the need to defend our allies and our friends when they're 1692 coming under attacks of this sort.

- I do have to note that I find it particularly galling that the only words that the city auditor has said himself, in this entire process, where that this process is designed to protect the innocent when there clearly is a person that has been harmed by the process, okay. She's clearly innocent, because one of the key components of violation of this ordinance is to prove substantial economic benefit to the party that she's employed by.
- 1701 Nobody to date has shown that at all, whatsoever. At that point the claims have not been substantiated. We are watchdogs of that commission. If there was 1702 ever any kind of out of line, or irresponsible, or suspicious behavior going on, 1703 if there was going to be anybody that was gonna notice it, it was gonna be 1704 Texas Campaign for the Environment, the Austin Zero Waste Alliance, those 1705 1706 folks. Not once did we ever see anything that would indicate any kind of wrongdoing. I believe that any votes that are in question here are unanimous 1707 votes. There's nothing on any of these where she has caused any benefit or 1708 harm to any party. So I think that that's important. 1709 1710
- 1711I recognize the importance of maintaining some I recognize that there's a1712legitimate valid argument in keeping an anonymous reporting process in place1713on something like this. I can foresee instances where that might be a good1714idea. I think that Chairman Kaplan's argument earlier that someone who's1715making a claim against a public official should be publicly known. I think1716there's an important argument there.
- 1718But the important thing here is also that who made this matters, because if it1719was another hauler that filed this complaint, in order to cause harm, in order1720harm TDS's reputation, in order to remove a zero waste advocate from a city1721commission that oversees the waste department, then the conflict of interest1722didn't happen when she voted on these items. The harm and the corruption, the1723waste, fraud and abuse happened when she was removed on their word.1724interest
- 1725Now maybe that's not what happened. But I have a sneaking suspicion,1726knowing a little bit about the waste industry in this city, that that might be1727exactly what happened here. So I think further we need a truly robust process1728here. We need to know who filed this complaint against her. This was in fact a1729lack of due process throughout this entire system, where she was accused first,1730harm accrued to her first and now we're getting the public process afterwards.
- 1732Our democratic process and environmental protection are intricately1733connected. That is the public interest that we are here to represent. The1734environment is in the public's interest, and when a private entity is able to1735harm somebody like this, it harms not only Daniela; it harms our entire1736environment as a city. We need to get this taken care of, and I hope you pass1737the resolution tonight.
- 1739 Kaplan Thank you Mr. Dobbs. Any questions from the Commissioners?
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1741 Mr. Dobbs, are you running for city council? 1742 1743 Mr. Randy Jewart. And followed up by Saul Sussman and then Michael Whellan after that. 1744 1745 1746 Jewart So you can tell that I dressed up to come to and support Daniela. 1747 1748 We appreciate that, thank you. Kaplan 1749 1750 Jewart I run a small business in town called Resolution Gardens. We work closely with the city, we're working with the St David's Foundation and a number of 1751 the rec centers building gardens for senior citizens. That's how I met Daniela, 1752 when she came as a city employee to help with the composting operation that 1753 we started at the South Austin Senior Center. 1754 1755 1756 And I came tonight and I could talk a lot about her, her company, my company has worked at her house, so I know a little about her. But apparently this 1757 process on a college educated person, and reading these pronouncements, and 1758 1759 trying to follow this presentation that happened earlier is really galling to me. 1760 1761 Jane Austen in one of her books says that the definition of legal is the 1762 protection of the rights of property and it's very clear that this is a legal issue, that the city of Austin has a hell of a lot of property, and a hell of a lot of 1763 interest in supporting some notion of legality and ethics against a person, that 1764 usually when I see her, is dressed like me. 1765 1766 1767 And she's lost her job, and she's lost her standing in the community. This is disgusting. It's really, really, terrible. And I agree with Stacy about 1768 Mike Martinez, because that's part of this process, too. Apparently this secret 1769 council can tell the council member whatever, and then it just goes public. 1770 1771 1772 So we're not here to defend Daniela, this isn't a hearing. We're here to help you folks do what you can do about it. And what I hope you can do about it is 1773 pass this resolution, because she's being really big here, to only ask for an 1774 1775 apology, and only ask that you guys do something to help this process for people in the future. And it could be a hell of a lot worse if she had the 1776 resources because there's a lot of demonstrable harm that has happened to her, 1777 1778 at the city's expense and processes. 1779 1780 As far as conflict of interest goes, our President has appointed our Ag Department person in the United States, is a former Monsanto employee, 1781 okay? Conflict of interest is part of how business is done in this country. It's 1782 part of everything. And there's a hell of a lot of people that benefit incredibly 1783 1784 financially by that back handed, conflicting, good old boy, bullshit. 1785 This woman has not benefited, this is not a conflict of interest, and it's really 1786 important as an ethics committee, that you guys have a handle on what a 1787 conflict of interest really is. And that this group that is attacking people, they 1788 better know what it is. Thank you. 1789 1790

1806		I saw with Daniela. She gave considerable time and effort, and I can't, there is
1807		no doubt in my mind that she would have acted in any way to compromise her
1808		integrity, or the integrity of the body.
1809		
1810		As I heard the presentation though, from the integrity unit, I was really
1811		appalled. I understand the need for some avenue of, for anonymous
1812		complaints, but there needs to be due process in this, for the person who is
1813		accused, and there were no safeguards, and I really would call on this
1814		commission to do whatever it can, to make sure that this unfair process is
1815		changed and bought under control. Thank you.
1816		
1817	Kaplan	Thank you for your time. Any questions from Commission?

1819		Okay, next up is Michael Whellan with two folks donating time, so he gets

1830		by what happened.

1832		I'm very troubled that there is no, at least in this case, that there was no
1833		provision for the auditor's making mistakes. There's no appeals process it
1835		seems, or at least there wasn't here, and now we're met with stonewalling.
1835		And I think there are some very fundamental flaws here. There was not an
1837		opportunity guaranteed to Daniela to see the report before it was issued, to
1838		correct mistakes that were in the report regarding the supposed benefits of the
1839		votes that they sighted.
1840		
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1841		There needs to be some kind of do over. Whether that's you folks doing your
1842		own investigation and clearing her, whatever it takes, this wrong needs to be
1843		righted. And you folks seem to be the ones that have the power to do that. Or
1844		at least, help us put pressure on the City Council to do that.
1845		
1846		
1847		How come the City Council was not notified of this case when the
1848		overpayment of that city employee? We've seen a lot of problems with the
1849		auditor's department. I was very troubled back recently another Latina
1850		commissioner was accused of wrongdoing, and her reputation was dragged
1851		through the mud, and there was no basis for those allegations either.
1852		
1853		I hope that new leadership at the auditor's office can help change this, but it
1854		goes way beyond just new leadership in terms of the auditor. The process is
1855		flawed and needs to be fixed. When you have a commissioner like Daniela
1856		who, and I'm sure most of our commissioners are this way, are trying to do
1857		what they think is right for the city. They confer with the people that they are
1857		taking direction from in that department, and then not only are they on the
1858		front page of the paper, they lose their job.
1859		nont page of the paper, they lose then job.
		This was really beyond the rale, and we need to make this situation right, and
1861		This was really beyond the pale, and we need to make this situation right, and
1862		I really urge you to pass the resolution before you, so that we can get down the
1863		road, and that future commissioners do not have to fear for their reputations
1864		and their livelihoods.

1899 1900 1901 1902 1903 1904		The reason I refer to this as flawed, is that the city auditor, even today, despite having an advanced copy of the resolution by the joint effort by several people, has failed to identify from where the authorization comes from for the auditor to reach the conclusion that someone has violated 2-7-63 or 2-7-64: the conflict of interest provision.

In fact Commissioner Einhorn in response to your question, he finally said these are not merely allegations, he upped the ante and little bit and noted that it is more than just an allegation once it is in a report. It is a finding of guilty by the city auditor without any effort to have a public process that is specifically identified in 2-7 in terms of a preliminary hearing or a final hearing
1913 1914 1915 1916 1917 1918 1919 1920 1921		As I've indicated publicly, each one of you, and every one of you, and every member of the board or commission is at risk given the auditor's interpretation of direct economic benefit. Nothing prevents the auditor, nothing, from explaining tonight how discussions on a special events ordinance, or on the universal recycling ordinance, had a direct economic benefit to Solurso, which is Daniela's company, or TDS a company that hired Solurso as an independent contractor.
1921 1922 1923 1924 1925 1926 1927 1928 1929 1930		We all know that there is nothing secret about policy determination, and there shouldn't be anything secret about policy determination, but if the city auditor is allowed to make decisions that are policy related, and in his web capture commissioners, because it's such a large web, then you're going to find that no amount of training, no quality integrity officer, would have saved Daniela, or will save any of you, or any other boards or commissioners, if the auditor is allowed to independently make a determination about what direct economic benefit means.
1930 1931 1932 1933 1934 1935		I want to run through this, and then obviously I will answer questions. By the way, we did find the course on the website. I'm surprised they say they're not on the website. I believe this one may have been on the website for some time, so that's something I want to clarify, Commissioner Einhorn.
1935 1936 1937 1938 1939		In the time required, before I forget, we will run through this, of course it's now working now. So the failures, they didn't apply the code, we're going to get into that in a minute. They didn't act within prescribed authority. We also know that there was a failure to notify the findings we've already gone over,

1940and a failure to provide a copy of the report for full distribution, to either1941Daniela or to TDS.

 There's no authority at all, there's no provision of the code that authorizes the auditor to conclude that a city official has violated conflict of interest prohibition, and yet you note at the end of the report, that's precisely what the commissioner - what the auditor has done on the very last page. He says, 'the evidence gathered through our investigation substantiated the allegation that Ochoa Gonzalez violated the conflict of interest requirements stipulated by the city of Austin.' It is not the auditor's job, and not within his prescribed authority. The Ethics Review Commission, on the other hand, is the only body authorized to determine whether someone has violated 63 and 64, after the already described undertaking of rigorous public process.

- 1954If you look at the language in 2-7, it is very specific: only the Ethics1955Commission gets to make this decision. Obviously after undertaking a public1956review process you then have five different violations which reflect1957proportionality of the alleged violation, it doesn't just jump to resignation. You1958have five options under 2-7-48.
 - We know that the auditor admits that he doesn't have any authority to decide. Mr. Hadvai, the same Mr. Hadvai you heard here today, on June 11^{th} 2014, told ZWAC precisely that – 'I would like to stress that our role is that of fact finders, not the decision makers.' Then why were they making decisions? Why were they reaching conclusions that were beyond their authority, and then publishing that not the decision makers, which are you, but publishing it to a full list of people on the cover sheet of their document?
 - The prohibition on conflict of interest, you are all very familiar with it, so I'm going to fly through this. There are two components. It has to effect, a natural person or entity and there has to be a substantial interest. The same is true for 64, you see the same definition, substantial interest, and it has to effect. What is important is the definition of affected. It means that you are reasonably likely to be subject to a direct economic effect or consequence either positive or negative, as the result of the voter's decision in question. More importantly, it does not include those persons or entities who are subject to an indirect, or secondary effect, from official action.
 - This is astounding in light of the three agenda items that were identified in the report. The URO's Universal Recycling Ordinance the Austin Energy Waste Disposal contract and special events ordinance. So the characterization first of all on the very front of the cover page on the auditor's report. He says, 'TDS agenda items, he says it several times under findings on the cover sheet. When you look at the sheet on the URO he says on the second to last page, and these are highlighted, he talks about the URO being TDS represented in attendance and advocated for a particular definition. For a generalized ordinance.
- 198619871988with the Austin Energy Waste Disposal contract TDS requested their contract,
not the agenda item by the way, TDS requested that their contract, TDS's

contract with the city be extended before the re-bid process, but that's what was not in front of the ZWAC for decision.

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2025 2026 And then finally, the Special Events Ordinance. TDS expressed concerns about stake holders not having input in ordinance development. What about the chilling effect on the public to speak up, and give their expert opinion on it. That's exactly what is happening here. I think Mr. Dobbs hit the nail on the head. Some quote "anonymous person" is trying to get back at others in the hauling business, they clearly provided this tip.

Even in the letter by Ed Shack, who has over thirty years of governmental experience in conflicts of interests, and he noted his thoughts on it that the URO special events ordinance affected all, or similarly, without any direct economic effect to any particular hauler. On the Waste Energy Disposal contract he said that TDS was not being awarded the contract, it was no longer in competition for the contract, and that ZWAC was only considering whether to award the contract to a totally different hauler. No direct economic benefit, no direct economic effect to TDS.

There was no fact finding. All the information I'm asking, there was no fact finding, all the information that Ed Stack relied upon was in the city staff back up to reach these conclusions.

And his conclusion. If the direct economic effect to TDS on agenda items as those set forth in the report, where any possible economic effect on TDS is so extremely remote, then it becomes highly likely that many other members of city boards and commissions are also violating the conflict of interest rule.

Here are my questions, none of which have been answered. What was actually before the ZWAC on each of these agenda items? We haven't heard from the auditor, and we know from the auditor's report that he hasn't been able to put it in there. I am the one that has been able to tell you. It was the Universal Recycling Ordinance, which applies equally to everybody. It's the Special Events Ordinance, which applies equally to everybody. And the Austin Energy Waste Disposal contract, which Texas Disposal System could not, it was not going to be awarded to them. They were not in competition for it.

2027Where is the analysis in the report concerning direct economic effect? There is2028none. And how is it that items of interest, read this report at the very, second to2029last page, before he identifies the agenda items, the city auditor's report says,2030'the following items of interest to TDS, because they showed up and made a2031few comments to help the process, to help the public process, they now2032become TDS's agenda item? No, that cannot be the case. That cannot be the2033standard.

- 2035What was Daniela's status? She's not an employee of TDS, she owned and2036operated Solurso. I still have one or two more -2037

Note, that the auditor failed to follow the review process, that's carefully outlined, the two step process I already referenced.

We have provided, to anybody who would accept it, copies of the transcripts of these hearings, we provided all the staff backs ups to these hearings, and what's important is you don't have to look beyond this report because there is no analysis of direct economic benefit. You know that there's two things you need to do. Substantial impact, which would be fact finding, I'm not asking for fact finding today, and direct economic effect. And you can't, sitting as a judge, sitting in judgment on an issue, make as a matter of law a decision about whether something has a direct economic effect, and if special events ordinance has a direct economic effect on TDS, then we are all in trouble. All 64 boards and commissions are in trouble. It's just not right.

You are the only authorized entity in the city of Austin to decide whether somebody has violated the conflict of interest rules, and we're not asking you to make a finding that she is innocent, which would require a final hearing in this resolution. Instead we're simply asking that you recommend that the report be retracted, and Council order its employee, the City Auditor, retract the report.

2139GregoryGood evening, Chair and Commissioners, I am Adam Gregory with TDS, and2140I will briefly address the concept of the direct economic effect of similar to2141what Michael has done, but I'm going to talk about how it specifically how it2142pertains to the agenda items that the auditor's report incorrectly called TDS2143agenda items.

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- The first item of issue I will address is the April 10th 2013 item concerning the award of an Austin Energy Waste Disposal contract through Republic Services. A significant portion of discussion that night had to do with the staff determination that recycling was not appropriate for the material that was subject of that contract. It had little to do with the commission's only potential action regarding this agenda item, which was to recommend that the city council either approve, or not approve, the staff proposed contract between the city and the Republic Services.
- 2154 Clearly approval or disapproval of the contract with the Republic Services did not have a direct economic effect on TDS. Even if the ZWAC had 2155 recommended that the council not approve the item, several more steps by the 2156 council staff and board and commission would have had to take place before 2157 any agenda item on this topic could even possibly have a direct economic 2158 2159 effect on TDS. If any effect existed at all, it could only be construed as an indirect effect, which is specifically excluded from the criteria for an ethics 2160 2161 violation.
- Another item sited by the auditor's report was the URO phase two ordinance, 2163 which, as you may know, is a requirement for all properties in the city to 2164 provide recycling services on a phased-in timeline depending on the size of the 2165 business. Nothing in this ordinance had a direct effect on TDS because there 2166 was no guarantee of TDS receiving any new business through this ordinance. 2167 And there are numerous other haulers engaged in these cases. If it did 2168 constitute a direct economic effect, then no commissioner if they work for a 2169 2170 business that conducts business within the city would be able to discuss this item without committing an ethics violation, which of course would be absurd. 2171 2172
- The same reasoning applies to the other URO related item that the report references, related to the data reporting contract for the URO, which pertained only to the award of a contract to a software company, and to data that was provided by waste generators, not waste haulers.
 - The other item sited in the auditor's report concerned the City of Austin Special Events Ordinance. Our interest in this item was limited to a complaint to the Commission that an ordinance was being put forward that had no stake holder involvement, and it's development concerning portions of that ordinance that were of concern to the ZWAC. The ordinance only placed requirements on generators of waste, not the haulers and processors. It did not confer on any hauler, including TDS, any rights or responsibilities. It is clear to us that no direct economic effect on TDS could come from any action the Commission could take on this item.

2226		mentioned.
2227 2228		If you listen to what they said, they said that they had authority to conduct this
2228		report, to draft this report, to publish it under city charter, under section 2-3-5
2230		of the city code, and under some kind of administrative bulletin relating to
2231		fraud, waste and abuse. We are not talking about fraud, waste and abuse here.
2232		We're talking about two specific violations which were alleged, that don't fall
2233		within that category. That's number one.
2234 2235		And then number two. The city auditor puts us in a situation that really creates
2235 2236		a catch 22 situation because their culture is the problem. We're free to act as
2230		jury, we're free to act as jurors, to publish this report, and by the way, we don't

2239 conducted the procedure, or how we reached those findings. That is truly 2240 appalling, especially when it refers to a hard working commissioner.

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2281 2282 The other issue is that they claim, you know, your question was very adequate. Who do they respond to? Who are they accountable for? If we can validate, if we validate or prove their actions, they're not responsible to anybody. And so that creates a situation to where they can tar and feather anybody and they don't have to disclose any information about how they reached that conclusion. And notice that they said, 'yes, we followed those standards and made reference to the quality standards for investigations that are promulgated by the federal government.

Now those standards are there, we took the time to review and they site very specifically that they have to provide an opportunity to gather all the evidence. That they have to protect the basic rights of all the parties involved. They seem more interested in protecting the rights of the person who made the anonymous tip, than they are in protecting the due process and basic rights of the person who is being accused of this violation. So I want to point that out.

Now, as to their authority. Let's be clear and I think it's worth highlighting, what does the city code say about this? The city code says that if the city auditor determines that a city employee or official may have violated the law -I'll skip the rest of the part - the auditor shall consult with, and obtain the advice from a city attorney, immediately report the suspected violation to the appropriate authority. And if the violation is criminal, notify the appropriate chief prosecuting authority.

Now, who is the appropriate authority in this specific case? Under section 2-7, under chapter 2-7, the only appropriate authority to make findings or determinations regarding conflicts of interests violations, is the Ethics Review Commission. What they put out here, what they put out here in this report, it doesn't say she *may* have. I mean this is pretty unequivocal, and it's a done deal. Once this is issued, and this is what's important, this is what's truly important to highlight, once this report is issued they say they're not recommending sanctions in here, but what effectively happens is that punishment occurs. And so we have a situation to where, on the basis of one report, which clearly says that Daniela Ochoa Gonzalez's actions constitute a violation of city code. They constitute a violation of city code. They and the say they is merits further analysis.

On the basis of this, a commissioner loses her job. She's forced to resign. She suffers great reputational damage, and huge emotional distress and anguish as a result of it.

2283So clearly today you have two options and these are pretty clear. One option is2284that you can approve, and you can do this - either expressly or by inaction -2285you can say we approve what the city auditor has done. That's one option we2286have. And so the consequences of that, for whatever motive, for whatever2287motive there may be, the city auditor will be free to publish any report about2288any commissioner without guaranteeing any basic due rights. I mean, Ms.

Ochoa Gonzalez had only one interview. She offered to provide information to the city auditor; they never took her up. They never provided her an opportunity. They could have said, 'these are our findings. What do you have to say?' And on top of that, if you look at this report, and if they're going to have the authority to do something like that, which they don't even have under the code, if they're going to do something like that, then at least they have to have the minimum responsibility, considering what's at stake here, they have to have the minimum responsibility that they have to clarify how a certain conduct meets a legal standard for that to constitute a violation. Do you see anything in the analysis? Do you see any reference at all indicating, or any kind of explanation, saying why any of these actions on these matters was reasonable linked towards the direct economic benefit of TDS. No explanations whatsoever.

So you have that one choice, where they can operate in the black box with unfettered power, to tar and feather anybody. And ironically if the report refers to a commissioner, there is no recourse. Because if you are a city employee, at least you have the recourse you can take with the manager, you can resort to the ombudsman process, there is no recourse once the city auditor issues that report. So they would be allowed to operate in a black box without providing any explanation whatsoever.

2311 And the other alternative is to approve that resolution that we have, that we provided to you. In order for you to approve that resolution, number one you 2312 have the power and jurisdiction to do so, because that's clearly set forth in the 2313 city code, that you have the jurisdiction to take actions on matters regarding 2314 violations of conflicts of interest, you have the authority to do so, and there's 2315 no requirements to approve that resolution. You don't have to make any 2316 findings of that whatsoever. I mean this is clear as daylight, that you can't 2317 accuse somebody, you can't make a determination that they, whether it's you 2318 or whether it's the city auditor, you can't accuse and make a determination that 2319 2320 a person violated the conflict of interest rules of the city without even explaining how the votes generated direct economic effect or was reasonably 2321 likely to generate direct economic effects. 2322

2324 So I think that those are the two choices that you have in front of you, and I hope that you will approve this resolution today. And let me tell you, speaking 2325 on behalf of Daniela, you know, it is very, very difficult, when you're a single 2326 commissioner, having to face up to the numerous attorneys, and the numerous 2327 resources that the city of Austin has. So you need to take that into 2328 consideration. That we're up here against an army of attorney's, an army of 2329 tax payer resources, and this is not a good use of tax payer funds, and attorney 2330 funds, trying to cover up for the city when they have done something that was 2331 2332 inadequate, and it was wrong. And you know my mama told me, when you do something wrong, you own up to it. And it's time for the city auditor to own 2333 up, and to make what's right in this specific case, and make what's right for 2334 the precedent of the city. Which is establish your authority, and establish the 2335 proper authority of the city auditor. Thank you very much. 2336 2337

2338 Price Wow, that was perfect timing... man.

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2339 Kaplan Commissioners, any follow up questions for Mr. Conde de Frankenberg? 2340 2341 Ruiz Mr. Conde de Frankenberg, putting aside this case, you said that, do you 2342 believe that conflicts of interest are examples of fraud, waste and abuse? Putting aside this case, if there's a substantiated incident of fraud, waste and 2343 2344 abuse, would you believe, I mean a conflict of interest, do you believe that to 2345 be fraud, waste and abuse? 2346 2347 Conde de Frankenberg What I believe is the following. That if they're characterizing, 2348 what's occurring in this specific report is if they're making accusations, 2349 determinations, that this person has violated the conflicts of interest rules, that are expressly set forth in 2-7-64, and 2-7-63. So there's only one process to do 2350 that. And the only process that's established in the code to do that is the Ethics 2351 Review Commission. That's what I believe. 2352 2353 2354 Ruiz Do you believe that the Ethics Review Commission, which has jurisdiction over 2-7-63 and 2-7-64, can make a determination without following our 2355 process, without following our preliminary and final hearing process? 2356 2357 2358 Conde de Frankenberg Well, so my thought process, and this is very important, is that 2359 on its face, to me on its face, the report produced by the city auditor, first of all 2360 exceeds its authority. It reaches conclusions that are beyond its authority. And 2361 then on top of that, we're not going to get into a fact contested issued, but on top of that it doesn't even substantiate or explain how, or why, these actions 2362 had a likelihood of creating a direct economic benefit on TDS. And so, those 2363 irregularities, those flaws, are so glaring that to allow the report to stand is just 2364 to me inexcusable. 2365 2366 2367 So the action that needs to, and so by the way, the city auditor, we shouldn't allow the city auditor to come back again, and say, 'oh okay, so we'll take this 2368 2369 back and we'll channel this through another manner.' 2370 2371 Kaplan Any further questions from Commissioners? Thank you very much. 2372 2373 We're going to move forward to these folks if they want to speak. Cathy Gattuso. Can y'all just raise your hands if you're here and would like to 2374 2375 speak? Bob Gregory, we'll give you some time. Mitchell Harrison, did you 2376 want to speak as well? Okay. Gary Newton, are you donating, or do you wish 2377 to speak as well? 2378 2379 I donate if somebody needs it. If not, I'll say a few words. Newton 2380 2381 Kaplan Okay. And Paige Hill Oliverio. 		unanimous, that we wanted this to come to you all because frankly we didn't

2393		you have a lot of questions.

2395		Beyond that it was, we felt pretty helpless, so we were pleased that we could
2396		forward this issue of Daniela on to you all. I was on the commission the entire
2397		time Daniela was a commissioner, and I just want to speak about my personal
2398		views about her.
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2400		She was very professional, much expertise, and as you heard from so many
2401		people has great compassion and sometimes taking unpopular positions for the
2402		environment, they were for waste. So I think she put herself out there in
2403		different ways. I do feel though that she has been helpless in this situation,
2404		how we've all felt, I know we were. I don't think she's been treated in a very
2405		humane way, and I'm thrilled that you all are going to make a working group
2405		to look at this. But I'm also hoping you do not forget her in this process, you
2400 2407		just can't do that, it's been a travesty the way she's been treated.
2407 2408		just call t do that, it's been a travesty the way she's been treated.
		There has been a lot of protection for the person that made the completer and

2410		that's okay, I guess, I'm not sure, but there's been no protection for her. And

2100		tane up my time to do it. I our years ugo you muy nuve read that I was on the

2487front pages, as Daniela was the other day. I had been disqualified. My2488company had been disqualified from a process for a recycling contract. As it2489turned out, we took that, had to take it to court, because the staff would not2490reverse the position. It went to state district court; the city staff elevated it to2491federal district court. The federal district court ordered the City staff out, and2492made them reverse the disqualification.

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- 2494The city staff disqualified TDS before we were even qualified to be2495disqualified, and it took a federal judge, Judge Yeakel, to overturn that. It is2496my 100% belief that the city of Austin, solid waste services city manager, the2497city staff, and the department, want to make public utility out of commercial2498collection of solid waste in this community. Like Austin Energy. It's an2499opportunity for the city to make a lot of money.
- They did not get a good response from me. I took them to court in it after going through their appeals process, and had no other place to go. I think they felt they thought they had an easy mark with Daniela here. You've seen tonight that these people that have been speaking to you, that she's not an easy mark. People believe in her. People believe in the process. And people were appalled by this process.
- 2508I believe she's completely innocent. I believe she was a target to get to TDS in2509a way that TDS could not respond. I'm happy to respond tonight that I believe2510in her innocence, I believe they had a motive to do this, to attack her. And if2511you read the report, the first time you have read it with no other input2512whatsoever, you too probably would have taken it hook, line, and sinker. Like2513Rick Cofer, Mike Martinez, and the American Statesman did because it was so2514convincing and so definitive in its positions.
- However we have no ability to go see those things. We've asked through an open records request, we've also asked the attorney general to release the information. They said we can't have it. These are audit documents; work papers.
- 2521This could happen to any of you, it could happen to any commissioner on any2522board or commission in the city of Austin. A city staff for whatsoever reason2523make accusation against you, and not have to even respond to the reasons why.2524It's appalling that this could happen.
 - I have some resources. I've wasted a lot of them to overturn that disqualification because it was wrong. I will take whatever resources I can have, that I can muster, to stand up for Daniela. She's an innocent person here who has been wronged. I urge you to take the action that you can to make this right. Not only for Daniela, but for others who can be attacked by city staff, and try to silence them like they tried to silence TDS before, and like I think they're trying to do here.
- 25332534253525352536I don't want to blur the issue by bringing in this past history, but I think it's
important for you to know that there is motive, in my opinion, by city staff on
what they're doing here. I urge you, please, to take action, to right this wrong,

2537		and to reverse it and to bring about a process change, so that this information
2538		can become public. I have no problem with anonymous complaint, but the
2539		information, the basis. I was told by Mike Martinez that there were other
2540		things in their file, far worse, far worse that they couldn't talk about it. What is
2541		that supposed to make you feel, or the Council feel? If you could only see
2542		these hidden documents you would think otherwise. Let it be known. These
2543		things have to be known to have this sort of thing happen to someone like
2544		Daniela, or to us.

2583		What I've heard over the last few months has really, really raised my concern.
2584		I'm petrified, I'm terrified to continue sitting as a commissioner, board
2585		member of this city, which I have done since I committed to serving my
2586		community.

2587I, as well, especially after hearing more tonight, and because I was appointed2588by Councilmember Martinez - you know it sounds like before the process2589ever, ever, hit due process, the Statesman heard about it, the public heard about2590it and everybody had heard what is supposedly not a conclusion, announced as2591a conclusion about a person who didn't even know that this had hit conclusion2592yet, until it hit the papers. She lost her job. She lost her livelihood.

As much as I love my community, I'm not up for that kind of potential future for myself. My future family, my current family. So I look forward to you passing this resolution. I love that you're putting together a working group. I would hope that the auditor's office also agrees, and collaborates with you, to fix the things that are broken in the process, so that I and 64 times 11 other boards and commissions members in this city, and more of them after 10-1, don't all go running and screaming and quit our jobs as civil servants. I don't know how many of you are now a little nervous about your position here on this commission, but I am very nervous. If this doesn't get fixed I may be quitting and a lot of other people too. Thank you.

- 2605 Kaplan Thank you for your time. Any questions? Alright, Mister Harrison, you're last.
 2607
- 2608HarrisonAs the last speaker before you, Mitchell Harrison, member of Austin boards2609and a commission member on the Community Development Commission2610representing the South Austin Neighborhood Center, more importantly just to2611thank you for your willingness to pick this up. Thank you everyone that's2612here, the staff that's involved, everyone that's learning through this, thank you2613for everything you can do to correct this.
- 2615 Kaplan Alright, thank you. Any questions from the commissioners? Alright.

2617 So we have two, or perhaps three agenda items, three relevant agenda items that we have taken up together. And just to circle back now that we've had a 2618 chance to hear from the public, and take us back to our agenda, we're on 4C, 2619 and D, and also 3C. These all have to do with the commissioner Ochoa 2620 Gonzalez. 4C is the ZWAC recommendation, D is an agenda item for us to 2621 make a recommendation to city council regarding jurisdiction and chapter 2-7, 2622 and then 3C is similar to what we considered at our last regular meeting, 2623 possible action to file a complaint under our own initiative. 2624

- 2626Cindy, do we, should we get, can we get a legal briefing, similar to what you2627have in your e-mail during this public meeting? Or should we just refer to it2628ourselves as we move forward? Try to figure out what we can and can't do.
- 2630 Cindy Tom Did everybody read the e-mail?

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- 2632KaplanDid every commissioner have a chance to read the e-mail from Cindy that2633came out earlier today? Okay.2634
- 2635Cindy TomSo I would say that if you have any additional questions, ask me, and I will2636answer them.

2637 2638	Kaplan	Okay.
2639 2640 2641	Cindy Tom	This isn't your first rodeo on conflicts of interest on board members. You had a hearing, filed a complaint, and filed a hearing on this involving different board member. So you know that if you were looking at it on the merits, which
2642		you're not tonight, you're not having a hearing tonight, that what you would
2643		be looking at under code is whether there was a substantial interest in an entity
2644		that was effected by the voter decision before the ZWAC commission, so
2645		when it comes to the definition of effected, yeah, direct economic effect is part
2646		of that.
2647		
2648		I hope you all remember some of that from last year. We talked about it a lot.
2649		But definitely I can answer any further questions you may have.
2650		
2651	Kaplan	I'd like to kind of draw everyone's attention to a few of the options that we
2652		have on the table here in addressing the situation. So obviously we've already
2653		constituted a working group, and we've talked about that. We have before us a
2654		draft resolution provided by Ms. Ochoa Gonzalez and folks aligned with her in
2655		committee, with a long list of whereas findings, and then what I see as four
2656		resolutions. It's on pages two and three.
2657		
2658		And just for purposes of discussing this, if you all will humor me, I sort of
2659		numbered those resolutions one, two, three and four. Each of them asks us to
2660 2661		do a distinct thing, so just for purposes of discussing them, number them.
2662		We also have this ZWAC resolution, which is in our packet and, I believe, asks
2663		us to take some sort of action. And then we are agenized for filing a complaint
2663 2664		under our own jurisdiction, which as we've talked about before, is something
2665		that is laid out in code, and the Ethics Review Commission can do. Generally,
2666		the Ethics Review Commission exists to hear complaints of conflicts of
2667		interest, violation of ethics rules, campaign finance violations, pursuant to the
2668		city code.
2669		
2670		People - generally the process is that a complainant will swear out a
2671		complaint, and then we will have a hearing on it. However, we also have the
2672		ability under, to swear out our own complaint against someone if we think
2673		that, that that's something that we want to do.
2674		
2675		So we discussed this at our last meeting and there was a discussion on it, a
2676		healthy discussion, and the commission took no action. It's back on the agenda
2677		for reconsideration based on the facts that we've heard tonight as another
2678		possible avenue for action that we can take.
2679		As my discound lost time, the second lost has no shiller to bind of show
2680		As we discussed last time, the commission has no ability to kind of clear
2681		someone's name under the code, it's just not the way that code is laid out, and
2682 2683		something we can do. We can consider the allegations and have, hold hearings and find facts, and find whether or not there was a violation.
2683		
2685		So what we could do is go through a hearing and find that in fact there was no
2686		violation, or even earlier, we can decide to file a complaint and then find that

2687		there's no due process, or good cause, to continue to a final hearing. But as far
2688		as I see it, it's not the same as an acquittal. It's just voting to not proceed.
2689		
2690		So, I don't know if there's kind of a best way to take in what the action will
2691		be.
2692		
2693	Einhorn	Is it fair to say they would rather us look at the resolution first than to pursue
2694		that?
2695		
2696	Kaplan	Alright. If there's no other objection I think we can take a look at the
2697	IIupiun	resolution. And so I would draw your attention then to, first in the interest of
2698		time, to 'therefore be a resolved section' then the paragraphs 'be it further
2699		resolved' which I'm referring to as one, two, three and four. Let's take a look

2707		We have received some legal advice on what our abilities are as an Ethics
2708		Review Commission, to act in an appeal, no capability or to even make some
2709		kind of finding in respect to the auditor. And my understanding is that if the
2710		auditor is relying on code section 2-3, that is not a code section that is within
2711		our jurisdiction as the Ethics Review Commission.
2712		
2713		So we would have no ability to do anything with respect to the auditor, with
2714		respect to 2-3. However, we certainly have jurisdiction over 2-7, so if we
2715		wanted to do or say something, with respect to the auditor, that's something
2716		that we may be able to do.
2717		•
2718		So I want to open it up on discussion. Discussion on this first 'be it further
2719		resolved.'

You have more than two 2740 Cindy Tom options before you. You have many options. You have a resolution before you, 2741 you don't have the authority to make resolutions, but you have authority to 2742 2743 make recommendations to council regarding provisions of city code and city 2744 charter under your jurisdiction, you can write your own resolution or your own 2745 recommendation if you don't like what's been bought before you. You can co-2746 op some of what's in that, if you do like it, your choices aren't 'nothing' or 'adopt exactly what has been brought to you.' You have authority to adopt 2747 vour own language, and we can totally type that up right now if you want to 2748 2749 do it. 2750 Kaplan 2751 Well, you know, let's do this so we know where we are. Am I hearing a motion 2752 to adopt this resolution as it is written right now? Right - not hearing a motion 2753 like that. Would discussion help this body to understand how we want to act, if we want to act at all, on the particular topics of this resolution? 2754 2755 2756 Price What I will say is I think there's a lot of information in here that we probably cannot pass, but I do like, probably the very last paragraph of this resolution 2757 2758 that we could put in the ledger. 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3088So what we'd like to do in supporting that decision, and this is why this is3089important. Because we believe that what's happened here has no recourse3090through your process now. Because in fact what's happened so far is that Ms.3091Daniela Ochoa has already been punished. She's already suffered all the3092consequences. So even if you now find her guilty, the sanctions that will be3093applied are less severe than what has occurred to her already.

- 3095And on the opposite side, your determination, your determination will not3096entirely clear her name either. So that's why we were so strong in favor of not3097going through this process because it's ludicrous to go through this process3098because she's already been punished. In fact, she has already been punished.3099And if we go through the hearing process, you're not going to be able to3100resolve this situation.
- 3102But in any case, in light of what has transpired in the course of your3103discussions, what we'd like to do, we'd like to present our own complaints. So3104my client right now in front of the city clerk. We'll present our own3105complaints in which she, complaints against her, because we're concerned of3106the implications of what may be perceived in the public view that you are also3107now proceeding against her.3108
- 3109KaplanI'll defer, having heard that for the first time, I'll defer to staff's thoughts3110about whether or not that's possible, but I will say that generally if any3111member of the public wants to swear out a complaint, pursuant to the rules of3112the city code then we will follow our procedure. The complaint has to be a3113sworn written complaint made to the city clerk, I don't think we have the form3114with us today, and the clerk's open every day, and anybody could have gone in3115at any point of time through this process. So you don't need to do it tonight.
- 3117Cindy TomI just want to remind you all the process is set out in code. The individual who3118swears in the complaint is considered the complainant, and they have the3119burden in proof in making the case against the respondent. It would seem3120somewhat nonsensical for the respondent and the complainant to be the same3121person.
- A different person could make a complaint. The answer may be that this commission has no authority over the city auditor with regard to their reports so you might need to look somewhere else.
- 3127KaplanHold on one moment, Commissioner Einhorn. Mr. Whellan, you said "how3128else do we?" and then you stopped. Can you finish that sentence please?3129
- 3130WhellanMy concern with 2-7-26 is that the Ethics Review Commission has3131jurisdiction over this chapter, which is 2-7. And that's why we have this3132second to last item, which is you can make a recommendation to the city3133council that the report be retracted, because it reached conclusions that are,3134can only be made by this body, which is set forth in 2-7. And that is what,3135that's the relief, the bottom line kind of relief that Daniela was seeking.

- 3136 Otherwise she has to swear a complaint against herself just to get another 3137 hearing – an initial pre-hearing here. It's the only way to really demonstrate what a kangaroo court the auditor has created by his actions. There is no other 3138 way to take action that is stronger for her to turn this upside down, and 3139 demonstrate how ludicrous this has become. 3140 3141 3142 Einhorn Mr. Whellan I don't entirely agree with that because I think that as resolution 3143 itself states, ours would only be a recommendation to the city council to order 3144 the auditor retract this report. So I think the recourse for her is to go directly to 3145 the city council. 3146 3147 Whellan With your recommendation that the council do that, it gives it more weight than her just going to the city. 3148 3149 3150 Einhorn But how do we do that without our formal process? 3151 3152 Whellan Because your formal process requires fact finding, and we're not asking you to 3153 do fact finding. We're asking you to look at the code, which says you're the 3154 only ones who have the discretion to make a conclusion. And as Mr. Ruiz pointed out, the very first page of the auditor's report, the very first page 3155 3156 makes conclusions under findings. He says "constituted conflict of interest 3157 violations." He says it twice in the middle of the page. It isn't done in a way that is equivocal. It says her subsequent participation in discussions and voting 3158 related to TDS agenda items on February 13th and August 14th, quote 3159 'constituted conflict of interest violations as defined in the city code'. So he's 3160 made, just as a matter of law, not with any fact finding, almost as a motion for 3161 summary judgment, he has found, made conclusive, the finding that is solely 3162 in your discretion in chapter 2-7. 3163 3164 3165 And I would say that the advice that we are trying to get from the legal Einhorn 3166 department is to determine whether we do have sole jurisdiction over that. For me...I'll leave it there. 3167
- 3169KaplanOkay, we have a comment for a member of the public, unless there's an3170interjection from the commission.
- 3172 Cindy Tom Please state your name again.
- 3174 Kaplan Please state your name.

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3176 Schneider My name's Robin Schneider. I think it's really this commission should stand 3177 up for itself. If you folks are the ones that are supposed to determine conflict of interest violations, your words to city council is important. And we can go 3178 3179 to city council about it, and we will probably go to city council about it, but your backing gives it much more impact. You've had this on your agenda 3180 twice. By failing to take a strong stand tonight, you are basically giving a 3181 3182 signal to the city council that we can't make a decision about whether there 3183 was any, whether the auditor stepped over the line. I think it's clear that the auditor stepped over the line, and in fact what I want to do is, is to file a 3184

3185complaint against the auditor for their abuse of the law, in terms of crossing3186over that line.

- 3188KaplanThank you. Any questions from commissioners? Alright. Anything further in
respect to this issue?
- 3191 Conde de Frankenberg You know to me it's trouble. There's no finding of fact that's required here. You can just look at that auditor report and you can see that 3192 3193 there's nothing in here that makes any explanation as to how there's a likelihood of direct economic benefit, or direct economic effect. And so is it 3194 that difficult for you to look at that? Is it that difficult for you to take a stance 3195 and say they put out all these allegations here, we have to do it right. And the 3196 right process to do it is the process that you have jurisdiction over. 3197 3198
- 3199KaplanCounselor, it's not difficult. We're just trying to find a place within our
authority, in code, to do that. If we don't have the authority to do it, I don't see
a way for us to do it. It's not difficult; it's just maybe not possible.32013202
- 3203Conde de FrankenbergCould I ask you a question? So is there anywhere in the code, is3204there any reference to the city auditor having authority over 2-7-64 and 2-7-320563? There is no reference to it. But there are reference to your jurisdiction over3206it.3207
- 3208 Kaplan So this is one of the questions that the working group is going to address. Whether or not there is exclusive jurisdiction for the Ethics Review 3209 Commission over these particular provisions of 2-7. We don't have an answer, 3210 we've sought legal guidance on it, we have some, it's not entirely clear, which 3211 means that the answer is not an absolute yes. Never addressed this issue 3212 before, that's why we've constituted a working group on this already. So 3213 we've already taken action, and the action will happen quickly, because of our 3214 quick turnaround. It's not going to be a quarterly thing, because we have a 3215 3216 quick turnaround for our next meeting. Hopefully we will have some recommendation by that time. But at this point that is the action that the 3217 commission has decided to take. 3218 3219
- What we have to still discuss on the agenda is whether the commission wants to file a complaint under its own power against Ms. Ochoa Gonzalez. Again, this is the second time it's come up and so it will be the last time the commission decides whether to take this particular action. commission. I obviously have only been your liaison for almost a year and a

3318		power to hear complaints and rule on them. Hearing your complaint went
3319		through another channel, everyone's concerned. Council exists to address
3320		these problems, but if the problem continues to come before us, asking us to
3321		essentially find facts, the way I see it is we can't adopt or dispute. We can't do
3322		either; we can't adopt or dispute the report of the auditor without finding some

3326		auditor, that's why we're having this difficulty.

There's a lot of - Chairs are coming to us without any specific training on Robert's Rules, or conducting a meeting.
3416 3417 3418 3419 3420 3421 3422 3422 3423 3424 3425		A lot of this came out of discussions with past boards. We're also looking at how we can work with not only board and commission members, but the staff liaisons, on how we help you all develop a good working relationship between your members and the staff liaisons. Y'all have a good working relationship. I've been to enough of you meetings that I know you have a good working relationship. That's not the case for all boards and commissions. And as I stressed to the board and commission members, and the staff liaisons, this shouldn't be an adversarial relationship, but in some instances it is.
3426 3427 3428		So we want to try to focus on some of that, try to provide tools and training that we can give them. Staff training currently is mandatory

3433 Janette Sure, the staff training. Currently we provide training, but it is optional. They 3434 don't report to me, I don't have jurisdiction over staff because they report to the city manager typically. So I have got at least a commitment from the city 3435 mangers office to make at least initial training for all staff liaisons to be 3436 mandatory, using the 10-1 as an excuse that we're going to have lots of new 3437 board members, lots of changes. These staff need to understand what your role 3438 3439 is, what their role is, and how they need to assist you. So we have that commitment, and so we will be working on developing some training that will 3440 3441 be required for all of them, to be conducted this Fall and probably into 3442 December. 3443 3444 What I need from you all that might be helpful, is you do have the ethics 3445 handout? I would really appreciate any feedback, or suggestions, or additions, 3446 or enhancements, or whatever, that we need to make to this training material 3447 going forward. 3448 3449 Kaplan I've got one right out of the box. Can we get this thing in Spanish, and when 3450 can we get that? 3451 3452 Janette Yes, that's something I was going to talk about, and figure out. The clerk's 3453 office has increased, slightly, our budget for Spanish translations, but not to 3454 the extent that I can translate everything in Spanish, but we will work on 3455 trying to figure out how to do some of that. 3456 3457 Okay, good. I think we're going to put that on a future agenda item, to just Kaplan 3458 follow up and make sure we get it. 3459 3460 Janette It's something council has expressed interest in. The problem is trying to figure out what to translate, city wide, and absorbing the cost for all those 3461 types of translations. We have increased the number of items that we are 3462 3463 translating in Spanish related to elections so Board and Commission training 3464 must be another area we can look at. 3465 3466 Price My only, you know I haven't looked at this in detail, but my only other 3467 suggestion when you're talking about a Chair, I think that's a great idea, but have that as a completely separate module for the Chairs, because as much as, 3468 3469 I really did, I was surprised by how much I did like the training online, you 3470 guys did a great job of making it interesting and keeping it moving. But if I had to add another hour to it. I would... 3471 3472 3473 Janette Some of the other things we are considering in addition to, you know we went 3474 strictly to online training. Some folks like it, some folks don't. 3475 3476 Kaplan I like when the videos are working. 3477 3478 Janette Right, because there are some technical difficulties we can't fix. And, you 3479 know, honestly, sometimes when I'm doing online training, you know, go up and down and I find myself lost. And so one of the things that came out of the 3480 board and commission task force was maybe having a workshop where folks 3481 3482 who wanted to come and have face to face training could come in, knock out 3483 all of their training all in one session. So we're going to be able provide some 3484 options. If you don't want to come down to city hall and do face to face, you can spend eight hours on your time to do the training online.
