Dear Texas Disposal Systems Landfill, Inc. (TDSL):

Thank you for voicing your concerns in the protest submitted on May 14, 2019 in response to the City's RFI 1500 SLW6002 ("the RFI").

In order to receive a hearing on claims related to the RFI, an operator must comply with the protest procedures in Section 2.4 of the RFI and must state grounds of protest which are sufficient to proceed to a hearing. In accordance with Section 2.4.3, Austin Resource Recovery staff reviewed the claims in TDSL's protest and determined that the grounds for protest were not sufficient and the protest did not comply with the procedural requirements set forth in the RFI. The City considers this matter closed.

TDSL cannot receive any relief through the hearing process because TDSL has already qualified as an eligible vendor under the RFI. TDSL has also failed to comply with the protest procedures. Section 2.4.1 permits an operator to protest its own score, not the City's use of the RFI process, the City's RFI criteria, or the City's methods for measuring fulfillment of the RFI criteria. Therefore, review is not available for TDSL's protest against the RFI process, the City's Workforce Diversity criteria, or the City's Landfill Gas Beneficial Reuse criteria.

The only protest regarding TDSL's actual score pertains to records from the U.S. Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA). Please find attached the OSHA records which address TDSL's claim that there have been no severe injuries at TDSL facilities for the past five years. OSHA records state that four injuries have occurred at the TSDL facility at 12200 Carl Road from 2015 to 2017. If TDSL believes that these injuries have been reported in error, TDSL should address these concerns to OSHA. Again, given that TDSL was successful in its submission, any adjustment to TDSL's scores would ultimately not affect the outcome of this process.

Instructions to find injuries in OSHA Severe Injury Report:

- 1. Visit https://www.osha.gov/severeinjury/
- 2. Click on the "download data" button (an Excel file should download)
- 3. Select Column D (Employer) in Excel file and enable filter function
- 4. In filter, search by name (Texas Disposal Systems, Texas Landfill Management LLC, etc.), and check the box for all relevant names
- 5. Columns (E I) may be used to verify applicable injuries
- 6. Injury descriptions are in column P (Final narrative)
