Current Program

- Multiple vendor dumpsters – visually unappealing
- Inefficient collection – duplicate routes
- Excess wear and tear on streets
- Air pollution
- Less accountability

Benefits of Proposed Sole-Source Contract

- Cohesive planning and management
- Consolidated routes
- Fewer garbage trucks on City roadways
- Delays street repair needs
- Reduces carbon emissions
- Unified collection containers/dumpsters
- More aesthetically pleasing
- Establishes economies of scale
- Health and safety
- Accountability/oversight



Why Central Texas Refuse?

- Residential provider for CORR for 30 years
- Consistent, positive customer survey results
- Current provider for ~40% CORR commercial customers
- Integrate many commercial and residential routes



Transition Schedule

- November 4: City Council considers contract approval
- Nov – Dec: CTR reps visit and survey businesses; order new trucks/containers
- Jan – Mar: Containers arrive at staging area; delivered to customers with expired contracts
- April 30: Existing Franchise Agreements terminated
- Locked commercial rates through September 2023
